The Public's Rights to Information and Attendance at Meetings

YOU HAVE A RIGHT TO: -



To consider an application to transfer the premises licence in respect of: 'Mila, 102-104 Belmont Road, Hereford, HR2 7JS.

Recommendation

That:

Sub-committee determine the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community. They should give appropriate weight to:

- The steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objective of the prevention of crime & disorder,
- The application for transfer and any further supporting information,
- The guidance issued to local authorities under the Licensing Act 2003,
- The representation (including supporting information) presented by the police
- The Herefordshire Council Statement of Licensing Policy 2015 2020.

Options

- 1. There are two options open to the sub-committee
 - Grant the application for transfer or
 - Refuse the application

Reasons for Recommendations

2. Ensures compliance with the Licensing Act 2003.

Key Considerations

3. The application for the transfer of the premises licence has received a relevant representation from the police and is brought before the committee for determination.

Summary of Application

- 4. The licence was surrendered on 4 February 2019. There is provision under the Act which allows the licence to be re-instated, if an application is received within 28 days. Such application was received by June Clarke of JMC Licensing Consultants on behalf of Mr Mohammad.
- 5.
- 6. The transfer of the premises licence can be allowed to have immediate effect in certain circumstances. In this case as the application was requested to have immediate effect then Hersh Omar Mohammad is already the holder of the licence.

Premises History

- 7. The premises was first licensed in September 2015 as a Polish convience store selling alcohol.
 - 8. On 22 November 2016 a joint operation involving West Mercia Police and Herefordshire Council Trading Standards was undertaken which resulted in a large quantity (apprx. ¼ of a million) of illegal and non-duty paid cigerattes being seized together with a large quantity of tobacco.
 - 9. Two of the workers at the shop were found to be illegal immigrants and were detained by UK Immigration.
 - As a result the police launched an expedited review on 25 November 2016.

- 11. The licence was suspended on 29 November following the expedited review hearing before this committee.
- 12. A full review hearing was held on 15 December and the committee revoked the premises licence.
- 13. A new appplication was made for a premises licence on 18 February 2017 following the premises having been sold to Hardi Mohammed
- 14. Representations were received from West Mercia Police and Trading Standards.
- 15. The representations were agreed and as a result the licence was issued.
- 16. On the 12 December 2018, a joint Police, HM Revenue and Customs and UK Border. Agency operation took place at Mila, 102 Belmont Road, Hereford. A quantity of non-duty paid alcohol was found at the premises.
- 17. On 11 January 2019 an application to review the premise licence was received from West Mercia Police

Current Licence

- 18. The current licence (appendix 2) authorises the following licensable activities during the hours shown:
- Supply/Sale of Alcohol (For consumption off Premises)
 Monday Sunday 08:00-24:00
- 20. The licence is also subject to a number of conditions.

Summary of Representations

21. The police are the only responsible authority that can object to the transfer and have done so (appendix 3).

Community Impact

22. Any decision is unlikely to have any significant effect of the local community.

Equality duty

- 23. This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in section 1 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 24. Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest

and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

25. There are not considered to be any equalities implications arising from this report.

Financial implications

23. There are unlikely to be any financial implications for the authority at this time.

Legal Implications

- 24. The licensing authority must have regard to the promotion of the four licensing objectives namely; the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm in exercising its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Further regard should be had to the statutory guidance under Section 182 of the Act and the council's own statement of licensing policy.
- 25. The options available to the licensing authority on considering this application under the Licensing Act 2003 are set out in section 1 of this report.
- 26. The case of Daniel Thwaites Plc v Wirral Borough Magistrates' Court (Case No: CO/5533/2006) at the High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division Administrative Court on 6 May 2008, [2008] EWHC 838 (Admin), 2008 WL 1968943, Before the Honourable Mrs Justice Black.
- 27. In this case it was summed up that: -
 - A licensing authority must have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. Licensing authorities may depart from it if they have reason to do so but will need to give full reasons for their actions.
- 28. Furthermore the Thwaites case established that only conditions should be attached to a licence with a view to promoting the licensing objectives and that 'real evidence' must be presented to support the reason for imposing these conditions. It should be noted that hearsay evidence is admissible in the context of making decisions on licensing matters.
- 29. This judgement is further supported in the case of The Queen on the Application of Bristol Council v Bristol Magistrates' Court, CO/6920/2008 High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division The Administrative Court, 24 February 2009, [2009] EWHC 625 (Admin) 2009 WL 648859 in which it was said:
 - 'Licensing authorities should only impose conditions which are necessary and proportionate for the promotion for licensing objectives'.
- 30. In addition to this it was stated that any condition attached to the licence should be an enforceable condition.
- 31. The committee's attention is drawn to the Section 182 Guidance which states:
 - 11.27 There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises:
 - a. for the sale and distribution of drugs controlled under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 and the laundering of the proceeds of drugs crime;
 - b. for the sale and distribution of illegal firearms;

- c. for the evasion of copyright in respect of pirated or unlicensed films and music, which does considerable damage to the industries affected;
- d. for the illegal purchase and consumption of alcohol by minors which impacts on the health, educational attainment, employment prospects and propensity for crime of young people;
- e. for prostitution or the sale of unlawful pornography;
- f. by organised groups of paedophiles to groom children; as the base for the organisation of criminal activity, particularly by gangs;
- g. for the organisation of racist activity or the promotion of racist attacks;
- h. for employing a person who is disqualified from that work by reason of their immigration status in the UK;
- i. for unlawful gambling; and
- j. for the sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol.

Right of Appeal

32. Schedule 5 gives a right of appeal which states:

An appeal may be made within 21 days to the Magistrates Court by the police or any person who has made a relevant representation and by the premises licence holder once notified of the licensing authority's decision.

Risk Management

33. There is little risk associated with the decision at this time as the legislation allows a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within a period of 21 days of being notified of the decision in writing.

Consultees

34. The police are the only responsible authorities that can object.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

Age verification

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.



- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Below Cost Price

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

Licensing conditions

General

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of EVIDENTIAL QUALITY in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition.

Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits, outside areas, and all areas where the sale/ supply of alcohol occurs.

Equipment MUST be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings MUST be kept in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a period of 31 days and handed to Police on demand.

The Premises Licence Holder must ensure at all times a DPS or appointed member of staff is capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in recordable media format, an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or the Local Authority on demand. The Recording equipment and tapes/discs shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant, in the event of any failings actions taken are to be recorded.

In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment the Premises Licence holder/DPS MUST report the failure to the Police on contact number '101' immediately



An incident log must be kept at the premises. Incident log records will be retained for a period of 12 months from the date it occurred. It will made immediately available on request to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or the Police, which must record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue (where relevant to the licensing objectives)
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received (where relevant to the licensing objectives)
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any equivalent training course within 1 month of commencing employment at the premises. Where there are existing staff this training shall be completed within 3 months of the date that this condition first appears on the licence. Refresher training will be conducted at 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be kept on the premises and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.

Personal Licence Holder to be on the premises at all times.

Public Safety

Prevention of Public Nuisance

Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall be displayed at all exits to the premises requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area guietly.

Protection of Children from Harm

The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 Policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand of the Police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council. Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any sale area advertising the scheme operated.

A written or electronic register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable to provide required identification to prove their age. Such records shall be kept for a period of 12 months. It will be collected and reviewed on a daily basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.



Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority Hearing date: Thursday 2nd November 2017

No later than 14 days from the date that this condition first appears on the licence, the premises licence holder will ensure that there is an unobstructed view at all times into the licensable area of the premises. Provided that in respect of the street facing windows any obstruction will be restricted to the top 25% of the window and the bottom 25% of the window in each case. Summary of Application

- 4. The application for the change of designated premises supervisor and the consent form are attached at appendix 1.
- 5. The change of designated premises supervisor can be allowed to have immediate effect in certain circumstances. In this case as the application was requested to have immediate effect then Hersh Omar Mohammad is already performing that role.

Premises History

- 6. The premises was first licensed in September 2015 as a Polish convience store selling alcohol.
- 7. On 22 November 2016 a joint operation involving West Mercia Police and Herefordshire Council Trading Standards was undertaken which resulted in a large quantity (approx. ¼ of a million) of illegal and non-duty paid cigerattes being seized together with a large quantity of tobacco.
- 8. Two of the workers at the shop were found to be illegal immigrants and were detained by UK Immigration.
- 9. As a result the police launched an expedited review on 25 November 2016.
- 10. The licence was suspended on 29 November following the expedited review hearing before this sub-committee.

- 11. A full review hearing was held on 15th December and this sub-committee revoked the premises licence.
- 12. A new appplication was made for a premises licence on 18 February 2017 following the premises having been sold to Hardi Mohammed
- 13. Representations were received from West Mercia Police and Trading Standards.
- 14. The representations were agreed and as a result the licence was issued.
- 15. On the 12 December 2018, a joint Police, HM Revenue and Customs and UK Border. Agency operation took place at Mila, 102 Belmont Road, Hereford. A quantity of non-duty paid alcohol was found at the premises.
- 16. On 11 January 2019 an application to review the premise licence was received from West Mercia Police

Current Licence

- 17. The current licence (appendix 2) authorises the following licensable activities during the hours shown:
- 18. Supply/Sale of Alcohol (Off Premise)
 Monday Sunday 08:00-24:00
- 19. The licence is also subject to a number of conditions.

Summary of Representations

20. The police are the only party that can object to the change of designated premises supervisor and have done so (appendix 3).

Community Impact

21. Any decision is unlikely to have any significant effect of the local community.

Equality duty

- 22. This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in section 1 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 23. Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

24. There are not considered to be any equalities implications arising from this report.

Financial implications

23. There are unlikely to be any financial implications for the authority at this time.

Legal Implications

- 24. The licensing authority must have regard to the promotion of the four licensing objectives namely; the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm in exercising its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Further regard should be had to the statutory guidance under Section 182 of the Act and the council's own statement of licensing policy.
- 25. The options available to the licensing authority on considering this application under the Licensing Act 2003 are set out in section 1 of this report.
- 26. The case of Daniel Thwaites Plc v Wirral Borough Magistrates' Court (Case No: CO/5533/2006) at the High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division Administrative Court on 6 May 2008, [2008] EWHC 838 (Admin), 2008 WL 1968943, Before the Honourable Mrs Justice Black.
- 27. In this case it was summed up that: -
 - A licensing authority must have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. Licensing authorities may depart from it if they have reason to do so but will need to give full reasons for their actions.
- 28. Furthermore the Thwaites case established that only conditions should be attached to a licence with a view to promoting the licensing objectives and that 'real evidence' must be presented to support the reason for imposing these conditions. It should be noted that hearsay evidence is admissible in the context of making decisions on licensing matters.
- 29. This judgement is further supported in the case of The Queen on the Application of Bristol Council v Bristol Magistrates' Court, CO/6920/2008 High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division The Administrative Court, 24 February 2009, [2009] EWHC 625 (Admin) 2009 WL 648859 in which it was said:
 - 'Licensing authorities should only impose conditions which are necessary and proportionate for the promotion for licensing objectives'.
- 30. In addition to this it was stated that any condition attached to the licence should be an enforceable condition.
- 31. The committee's attention is drawn to the Section 182 Guidance which states:
 - 11.27 There is certain criminal activity that may arise in connection with licensed premises which should be treated particularly seriously. These are the use of the licensed premises:
 - a. for the sale and distribution of drugs controlled under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 and the laundering of the proceeds of drugs crime;
 - b. for the sale and distribution of illegal firearms;
 - c. for the evasion of copyright in respect of pirated or unlicensed films and music, which does considerable damage to the industries affected;
 - d. for the illegal purchase and consumption of alcohol by minors which impacts on the health, educational attainment, employment prospects and propensity for crime of young people;
 - e. for prostitution or the sale of unlawful pornography;

- f. by organised groups of paedophiles to groom children; as the base for the organisation of criminal activity, particularly by gangs;
- g. for the organisation of racist activity or the promotion of racist attacks;
- h. for employing a person who is disqualified from that work by reason of their immigration status in the UK;
- i. for unlawful gambling; and
- j. for the sale or storage of smuggled tobacco and alcohol.
- 32. Section 37 of the Licensing Act 2003 only permits application for a change of designated premises supervisor to be made by the premises licence holder.

Right of Appeal

33. Schedule 5 gives a right of appeal which states:

An appeal may be made within 21 days to the Magistrates Court by the police and also by the premises licence holder once notified in writing of the licensing authority's decision.

Risk Management

34. There is little risk associated with the decision at this time as the legislation allows a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within a period of 21 days of being notified of the decision in writing.

An incident log must be kept at the premises. Incident log records will be retained for a period of 12 months from the date it occurred. - (a) all crimes reported to the venue (where relevant to the licensing objectives)
- (b) all ejections of patrons

- (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any equivalent training course within 1 month of commencing employment at the premises. Where there are existing staff this training shall be completed within 3 months of the date that this condition first appears on the licence. Refresher training will be conducted at 6 monthly intervals. West Mercia Police OBJECT to the applications to transfer the premises licence to Mr MOHAMMED and to specify him as the designated premises supervisor.

West Mercia Police are aware that Mr MOHAMMED has been involved in the running of the premises since September 2018 and in October the same year stated he was the manager and was looking to buy the business. It is the view of West Mercia Police was in a position of responsibility and likely involved in the day to day running of the business and therefore would have been aware of the the items found at the premises that are now subject of the Police review application.

It is the view of West Mercia Police that to allow the transfer of the premises licence and ultimately the naming of Mr MOHAMMED as the designated premises supervisor will undermine the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder.

Summary of Application

- 5. The application (appendix 1) requests a variation to the premises licence as follows:
 - To add an outside bar in the "smoking area" as indicated on the amended plan
 - To vary the last entry time from 01:00 as it is currently to 02:30
- 6. In addition to this, the application requests to be allowed to remove a condition relating to SIA door staff and replace with a SIA condition that is more flexible.

Premises History

7. Previously the premises has been licensed as Bar Spirit, Shake & Stir and since 20 October 2017 the premises has been known as Rubix:

A variation was received on 8 May 2018 to vary licensable activity timings.

The licence was granted on 14 June 2018 and reads as shown below for the current licence.

Current Licence

8. The current licence (appendix 2) authorises the following licensable activities during the hours shown:

Live Music, Recorded Music, Sale/Supply of Alcohol Sunday – Wednesday 11:00 – 01:00 Thursday 11:00 – 02:00 Friday – Saturday 11:00 – 03:45

<u>Late Night Refreshment</u> Sunday – Wednesday 23:00 – 01:00 Thursday 23:00 – 02:00 Friday – Saturday 23:00 – 03:45

Non Standard Timings

10:00 New Years Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day. 11:00-03:45 on Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday on Easter weekend, Whitson weekend, spring bank holiday, August bank holiday, Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

Summary of Representations

9. Two (2) Objections have been received from the Responsible Authorities, West Mercia Police – appendix 3 and Environmental Protection – appendix 4. The applicant has engaged with both responsible authorities and has agreed additional conditions with West Mercia Police (appendix 5).

Community Impact

- 10. The premises falls within the heart of the Herefordshire Council Cumulative Impact Policy as shown within paragraph A7 of the Special Policy.
- 11. The cumulative impact policy creates a rebuttal presumption that all applications will be refused unless it can be shown that by granting the licence there will be no adverse effect on the promotion of the licensing objectives.

Equality duty

- 12. This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in section 1 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 13. Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.
- 14. There are not considered to be any equalities implications arising from this report.

Financial implications

15. There are unlikely to be any financial implications for the authority at this time.

Legal Implications

- 16. The licensing authority must have regard to the promotion of the four licensing objectives namely; the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm in exercising its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Further regard should be had to the statutory guidance under Section 182 of the Act and the council's own statement of licensing policy.
- 17. The options available to the licensing authority on considering this application under the Licensing Act 2003 are set out in section 1 of this report.
- 18. The case of Daniel Thwaites Plc v Wirral Borough Magistrates' Court (Case No: CO/5533/2006) at the High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division Administrative Court on 6 May 2008, [2008] EWHC 838 (Admin), 2008 WL 1968943, Before the Honourable Mrs Justice Black.
- 19. In this case it was summed up that: -
 - A licensing authority must have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. Licensing authorities may depart from it if they have reason to do so but will need to give full reasons for their actions.
- 20. Furthermore the Thwaites case established that only conditions should be attached to a licence with a view to promoting the licensing objectives and that 'real evidence' must be presented to support the reason for imposing these conditions. It should be noted that hearsay evidence is admissible in the context of making decisions on licensing matters.
- 21. This judgement is further supported in the case of The Queen on the Application of Bristol Council v Bristol Magistrates' Court, CO/6920/2008 High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division The Administrative Court, 24 February 2009, [2009] EWHC 625 (Admin) 2009 WL 648859 in which it was said:
 - 'Licensing authorities should only impose conditions which are necessary and proportionate for the promotion for licensing objectives'.
- 22. In addition to this it was stated that any condition attached to the licence should be an enforceable condition.
- 23. The case of Luminar Leisure Ltd v Wakefield Magistrates' Court, Brooke Leisure Limited, Classic Properties Limited, Wakefield Metropolitan District Council, heard before the High Court of Justice, Queen's Bench Division The Administrative Court, 18 April 2008, [2008] EWHC 1002 (Admin) would appear to be relative in this matter.
- 24. This matter involved an application by Luminar for a nightclub which was located just outside the Wakefield Cumulative Impact Area. The application was granted by the Local Authority and that decision was subsequently appealed.
- 25. The judge allowed the appeal on the grounds 'because of the effect which the increase in the number of people attending such a venue in Westgate would have, generally, on crime and disorder in the area'.

- 26. The matter was further appealed to the High Court by way of case stated.
- 27. Three questions were posed for the Judge to address. The last question asked was 'Was it a proportionate response to refuse the licence rather than to impose conditions on any licence?'
- 28. In respect of this it was stated 'To put a limit on the extent to which cumulative impact is legally relevant is something which seems to me not to be permitted by the statute. But with all that this condition was not sought. So the answer to question 3 is "yes".

Right of Appeal

29. Schedule 5 gives a right of appeal which states

An appeal may be made within 21 days to the Magistrates Court by the police or any person who has made a relevant representation and also by the premises licence holder once notified of the licensing authority's decision

Risk Management

30. There is little risk associated with the decision at this time as the legislation allows a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within a period of 21 days of being notified of the decision in writing.

I have also considered the Prevention of Crime and Disorder objective and feel that as my premise hasn't had any incidents of Crime & Disorder since being re-branded as Rubix then replacing the SIA condition to a risk assessed basis is proportionate along with extending the last entry time to 02:30hrs. Amending the SIA condition allows us to meet the security needs of the establishment as required rather than set times which are not always applicable. Allowing the last entry time to be extended will help crowd control for premises within the CIZ thus reducing the risk

of crime and disorder in the streets. Also with the last entry time being extended it will reduce the risk of confrontation for my staff.



This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates.  - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

1 (one) SIA registered Door Supervisor shall be deployed at main entrance to the premises from 21:30 hours to termination of licensable activities.

The DPS will employ SIA door staff at other times when risk assessment dictates door supervision to be necessary.

The Premises Licence Holder or DPS or a person nominated by them in writing for the purpose, shall maintain a register of door supervisors which shall be kept on the premises showing the names and addresses of the door supervisors, their badge numbers and shall be signed by the door supervisors as they commence and conclude duty. The register shall be made available on demand for inspection by an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), or the Police or an authorised officer of the SIA.



All drinks of 330ml or more will be served in toughened, tempered or polycarbonate drinking vessels. As other glass supplies are replenished, they will replaced with toughened, tempered or polycarbonate drinking vessels.

CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of EVIDENTIAL QUALITY in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition.

Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits, outside areas, and all areas where the sale/ supply of alcohol occurs.

Equipment MUST be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings MUST be kept in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a period of 31 days and handed to Police on demand.

The Premises Licence Holder must ensure at all times a DPS or appointed member of staff is capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format EITHER DISC or VHS to the Police/Local Authority on demand.

The Recording equipment and tapes/discs shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant, in the event of any failings actions taken are to be recorded.

In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment/DPS MUST report the failure to the Police on contact number **0300 333 3000** immediately.

An incident log must be kept at the premises, and made immediately available on request to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police, which must record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) any complaints received
- (c) any incidents of disorder
- (d) any refusal of sale of alcohol
- (e) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- (f) the minimum details to be taken in the log is date and time of incident or visit, description of incident or visit, name of any witness if possible

A personal licence holder shall be on duty within the licensed area of the premises after 8pm each day when the premises operates for the sale of alcohol.

The Premises Licence Holder/DPS shall successfully complete the BBAB NCPLH level 2 (or recognised equivalent).

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in Responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any other training recognised and agreed with Herefordshire Council Trading Standards within one month of the date that this condition appears on this licence. (Where there are exisiting staff this training shall be completed within 3 months of the date that this conditon first appears on the licence). Retraining every 6 months. Training records shall be kept on the premises and shall be produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.



All existing staff shall be trained within one month of the date this condition appears on this licence. All new staff shall be trained within one month of taking up employed. All staff shall be retrained six monthly thereafter. The training shall included:

- 1. Drugs Awareness
- 2. Conflict resolution
- 3. Selling to under age person
- 4. Selling to drunks
- 5. Training records shall be kept on the premises which shall show the area of training covered, the date of the training, the name of the person and shall be signed by the trainer and trainee. This shall be produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) on demand.

No admissions for new customers will be allowed to the premises after 0100hrs.

No open containers will be removed from the premises.

Public Safety

All staff shall wear either clothing with a staff logo or a lanyard with a staff badge and company logo attached which identifies them as members of staff of the premises.

A HSE Compliant Industrial High Response First Aid Kit for 21-50 people shall be kept fully stocked at the premises and kept behind the bar. Such kit shall contain:

- 1 x Guidance Leaflet
- 60 x Washproof Plasters
- 6 x Eye Pads with Bandage
- 8 x Triangular Bandages
- 12 x Safety Pins
- 16 x Assorted Sterile Dressings
- 20 Moist Wipes
- 3 Pairs Disposable Gloves

The Licensed premises shall not be used for any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism unless the hypnotist has been licensed by the relevant Local Authority in England or Wales. Any performance must comply in accordance with any conditions attached to that licence.

Special Effects

The installation and use of laser beams, pyrotechnics or real flames, explosive or highly flammable or smoke producing agent, for any purpose shall not be permitted without prior notification to the Licensing Authority. Notification, together with a detailed description of the method of use, shall be made to the Licensing Authority not less than 14 days prior to the day on which the laser equipment is to be used.

Strobe lights shall be operated on a fixed rate of not more than four flashes per second. Where more than one strobe light is used, the flashes shall be synchronised. In any case, such lights shall not be installed without notify the Licensing Authority in writing.

The use of foam shall not be permitted without prior notification, in writing, to the Licensing Authority.

All exits doors must be capable of being opened without the use of a key, card, code or similar means.

- 7. The applicant had to re-start the consultation period on 24th January 2019 (first day for consultation was 25th January 2019) due to not displaying blue notices at the premise which is a requirement under The Licensing Act 2003 (Premises Licenses and Club Premises Certificates) Regulations 2005, Regulation 25.

Current Licence

8. The current licence (appendix 2) authorises the following licensable activities during the hours shown:

<u>Sale/Supply of Alcohol (for consumption off the premises)</u> Monday – Sunday 06:00 – 23:00

Summary of Representations

9. Two (2) representations have been received from the Responsible Authorities, West Mercia Police – appendix 3 and Trading Standards – appendix 4. These have not been agreed by the applicant. West Mercia Police's current position with regards to their representation can be found at Appendix 5.

Community Impact

10. Any decision is unlikely to have any impact on the local community

Equality duty

- 11. This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in section 1 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 12. Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.
- 13. There are not considered to be any equalities implications arising from this report.

Financial implications

15. There are unlikely to be any financial implications for the authority at this time.

Legal Implications

- 16. As relevant representations have been received, the sub committee must determine this application in accordance with section 3.5.7 (e) of the Herefordshire Council constitution. The relevant representations are representations which relate to the likely effect of the grant of the application on the promotion of the licensing objectives. In determining the application, the sub committee must consider whether the granting of the variation would have the effect of promoting or damaging the licensing objectives.
- 17. The four licensing objectives are the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm in exercising its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Further regard should be had to the statutory guidance under Section 182 of the Act and the Council's own statement of licensing policy. The options available to the licensing authority are set out in section 1 of this report.
- 18. The Committee should be aware of a number of stated cases which have appeared before the Administrative Court and are binding on the Licensing Authority.
- 19. The case of Daniel Thwaites Plc v Wirral Borough Magistrates' Court (Case No: CO/5533/2006) at the High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division Administrative Court on 6 May 2008, [2008] EWHC 838 (Admin), 2008 WL 1968943, Before the Honourable Mrs Justice Black.
- 20. In this case it was summed up that: -
 - A licensing authority must have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. Licensing authorities may depart from it if they have reason to do so but will need to give full reasons for their actions.
- 21. Furthermore the Thwaites case established that only conditions should be attached to a licence with a view to promoting the Licensing objectives and that 'real evidence' must be presented to support the reason for imposing these conditions.
- 22. This judgement is further supported in the case of The Queen on the Application of Bristol Council v Bristol Magistrates' Court, CO/6920/2008 High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division The Administrative Court, 24 February 2009, [2009] EWHC 625 (Admin) 2009 WL 648859 in which it was said:
 - 'Licensing authorities should only impose conditions which are necessary and proportionate for the promotion for licensing objectives'.
- 23. In addition to this it was stated that any condition attached to the licence should be an enforceable condition

Right of Appeal

24. Schedule 5 gives a right of appeal which states:

An appeal may be made within 21 days to the Magistrates Court by the police or any person who has made a relevant representation and also by the premises licence holder once notified of the licensing authority's decision.

25. The decision of the licensing authority will not have effect until the end of the period allowed for appeal, or until the appeal is disposed of.

Risk Management

26. There is little risk associated with the decision at this time as the legislation allows a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within a period of 21 days of being notified of the decision in writing.



This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Additional mandatory conditions:

The responsible person [as defined by Section 153(4) Licensing Act 2003] shall: -

- take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises
- ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another
- ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Sale of alcohol below permitted price



A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

Age verification

- The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18
 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request,
 before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a
 holographic mark.

Smaller measures

The responsible person shall ensure that-

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Mandatory condition: door supervision

Each individual required to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

General

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

The premises licence holder/DPS must be a member of the pub watch scheme, which operates an early warning system, at all times.

On Fridays, Saturdays and all other days licensed to remain open until 0345hrs or later in the case of New Year's Eve a minimum of 2 (two) SIA Licensed Door Supervisors shall be employed at the premises from 21:00 hours until the termination of licensable activities.

One extra door supervisor will be required per 100 ratio thereafter. When employed externally SIA registered Door Supervisors shall wear Hi-Viz reflective jackets or vests. When employed internally they shall be readily identifiable as SIA registered Door Supervisors

1 (one) SIA registered Door Supervisor shall be deployed at main entrance to the premises from 21:30 hours to termination of licensable activities.

The DPS will employ SIA door staff at other times when risk assessment dictates door supervision to be necessary.

The Premises Licence Holder or DPS or a person nominated by them in writing for the purpose, shall maintain a register of door supervisors which shall be kept on the premises showing the names and addresses of the door supervisors, their badge numbers and shall be signed by the door supervisors as they commence and conclude duty. The register shall be made available on demand for inspection by an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), or the Police or an authorised officer of the SIA.



All drinks of 330ml or more will be served in toughened, tempered or polycarbonate drinking vessels. As other glass supplies are replenished, they will replaced with toughened, tempered or polycarbonate drinking vessels.

CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of EVIDENTIAL QUALITY in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition.

Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits, outside areas, and all areas where the sale/ supply of alcohol occurs.

Equipment MUST be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings MUST be kept in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a period of 31 days and handed to Police on demand.

The Premises Licence Holder must ensure at all times a DPS or appointed member of staff is capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in a recordable format EITHER DISC or VHS to the Police/Local Authority on demand.

The Recording equipment and tapes/discs shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant, in the event of any failings actions taken are to be recorded.

In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment/DPS MUST report the failure to the Police on contact number **0300 333 3000** immediately.

An incident log must be kept at the premises, and made immediately available on request to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police, which must record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) any complaints received
- (c) any incidents of disorder
- (d) any refusal of sale of alcohol
- (e) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- (f) the minimum details to be taken in the log is date and time of incident or visit, description of incident or visit, name of any witness if possible

A personal licence holder shall be on duty within the licensed area of the premises after 8pm each day when the premises operates for the sale of alcohol.

The Premises Licence Holder/DPS shall successfully complete the BBAB NCPLH level 2 (or recognised equivalent).

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in Responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any other training recognised and agreed with Herefordshire Council Trading Standards within one month of the date that this condition appears on this licence. (Where there are exisiting staff this training shall be completed within 3 months of the date that this condition first appears on the licence). Retraining every 6 months. Training records shall be kept on the premises and shall be produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.



All existing staff shall be trained within one month of the date this condition appears on this licence. All new staff shall be trained within one month of taking up employed. All staff shall be retrained six monthly thereafter. The training shall included:

- 1. Drugs Awareness
- 2. Conflict resolution
- 3. Selling to under age person
- 4. Selling to drunks
- 5. Training records shall be kept on the premises which shall show the area of training covered, the date of the training, the name of the person and shall be signed by the trainer and trainee. This shall be produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) on demand.

No admissions for new customers will be allowed to the premises after 0100hrs.

No open containers will be removed from the premises.

Public Safety

All staff shall wear either clothing with a staff logo or a lanyard with a staff badge and company logo attached which identifies them as members of staff of the premises.

First aid

A HSE Compliant Industrial High Response First Aid Kit for 21-50 people shall be kept fully stocked at the premises and kept behind the bar. Such kit shall contain:

- 1 x Guidance Leaflet
- 60 x Washproof Plasters
- 6 x Eye Pads with Bandage
- 8 x Triangular Bandages
- 12 x Safety Pins
- 16 x Assorted Sterile Dressings
- 20 Moist Wipes
- 3 Pairs Disposable Gloves

The Licensed premises shall not be used for any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism unless the hypnotist has been licensed by the relevant Local Authority in England or Wales. Any performance must comply in accordance with any conditions attached to that licence.

Special Effects

The installation and use of laser beams, pyrotechnics or real flames, explosive or highly flammable or smoke producing agent, for any purpose shall not be permitted without prior notification to the Licensing Authority. Notification, together with a detailed description of the method of use, shall be made to the Licensing Authority not less than 14 days prior to the day on which the laser equipment is to be used.

Strobe lights shall be operated on a fixed rate of not more than four flashes per second. Where more than one strobe light is used, the flashes shall be synchronised. In any case, such lights shall not be installed without notify the Licensing Authority in writing.

The use of foam shall not be permitted without prior notification, in writing, to the Licensing Authority.

All exits doors must be capable of being opened without the use of a key, card, code or similar means.



Doors must be checked at least every 24 hours to ensure that they are capable of being opened. A record of this check shall be recorded in writing and shall be made immediately available to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police on demand.

Capacity limits

The maximum permitted numbers of persons in the premises including staff shall not exceed the numbers set within the fire risk assessment for the premises.

The capacity limit for the premises shall be: 120 Inside 80, Beer Garden 40,

Prevention of Public Nuisance

The external area of the licensed premises shall not be used by customers after 0230hrs save for smoking. This will mean no alcohol is taken into this area after 0230hrs. Steps shall be put in place to ensure that customers using this area after this time do not remain in this area after they have finished smoking.

Any speaker within the premises shall be directed away from any residential property

Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance.

The Premises Licence Holder or DPS must immediately comply with any request to adjust noise levels/ frequency spectra made by an authorised person. (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police.

Live or Recorded music shall be restricted to the internal areas only

No regulated entertainment will take place in external areas on any day after 24:00hrs (midnight)

After 24:00hrs, any external areas of the premises used for licensable activities shall be monitored by the designated premises supervisor or appointed member of staff, to prevent public nuisance

Windows (in the public areas) at the premises shall be kept closed after 23:00hrs

All external doors (to the public areas) shall be kept closed after 23:00hrs except during immediate access and egress

Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall be displayed at all exits to the premises requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall be displayed at all exits to any beer garden, patio area, and smoking area or similar, requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to be quiet

The use of explosives, pyrotechnics and fireworks of a similar nature shall not be used at the premises without written notification to the Licensing Authority

No waste such as bottles or refuse shall be placed outside the premises between 23:00hrs hours and 08.00hrs



No noxious smell emanating from the premises shall cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

Protection of Children from Harm

The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 Policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand of an authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the police or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council. Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any bar advertising the scheme operated.

A written register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable to provide required Identification to prove their age.

Such records shall be kept for a period of 12 months and will be collected on a daily basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.

No adult entertainment or services or activities must take place at the premises (Adult Entertainment includes, but is not restricted to, such entertainment or services which would generally include topless bar staff, striptease, lap-table, or pole-dancing, performances involving feigned violence or horrific incidents, feigned or actual sexual acts or fetishism, or entertainment involving strong and offensive language).

No person under the age of 18 years shall be permitted to be on the premises after 1900 hour other than a member of staff employed at the premises or a child of the premises licence holder or DPS

ALL existing conditions on the premises licence remain and will apply to the whole of the premises, including the external area, with the following amendments:

- The last entry time for all customers will be 0230hrs. No re-entry will be
 allowed for any customers after this time. A written system will be put in place
 by the Premises licence Holder to allow 'late night economy workers' entry to
 the premises after 0230hrs on production of evidence that they are employed
 as part of the 'late night economy' and have come from their place of work.
- The premises licence holder will have in place a Dispersal Policy which will be produced on demand to the Police or any other 'authorised person' as per the Licensing Act 2003.

To ensure there is no misunderstanding, the existing conditions (as amended as above) will remain in place, these include the restriction on the use of the external area after 0230hrs, the requirement to use poly carbonate etc vessels over 330ml and replace existing stock etc., and the requirements with regards to door staff.
