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

Purpose

To consider an application for a grant of a premise licence in respect of 'MaryGold, 14-15 Union Street, Hereford. HR1 2BT'.

Recommendation

THAT:

The sub-committee determine the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community. They should give appropriate weight to:

- The steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives,
- The representations (including supporting information) presented by all parties,
- The guidance issued to local authorities under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and
- The Herefordshire Council Statement of Licensing Policy 2015 2020.

Options

- 1. There are a number of options open to the sub-committee:
 - a) Grant the licence subject to conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application and the mandatory conditions set out in the Licensing Act 2003,

- Grant the licence subject to modified conditions to that of the operating schedule where the sub-committee considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and add mandatory conditions set out in the Licensing Act 2003,
- c) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates
- d) To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premise supervisor, or
- e) To reject the application.

Reasons for Recommendations

2. Ensures compliance with the Licensing Act 2003.

Summary of Application

5. The application (appendix 1) requests to grant a premises licence to allow the following licensable activities, during the hours shown, as follows:

Live Music, Recorded Music & Performances of Dance (Indoors/Outdoors) Monday-Thursday 10:00-01:00 Friday-Sunday 10:00-02:00

Sale/Supply of Alcohol (consumption on and off the premises) Monday-Thursday 10:00-01:00 Friday-Sunday 10:00-02:00

Late Night Refreshment (Indoors/Outdoors) Monday-Thursday 23:00-01:00 Friday-Sunday 23:00-02:00 Non Standard Timings: New Year's Eve & Day extend terminal hour until 03:00 Christmas Eve & Day extend terminal hour until 02:00

Premises History

- 6. The premises were previously licensed as Champagne Signature.
- 7. It subsequently changed its name to MaryGold.
- 8. From April 2015 until February 2017 Mikayeel Deen was the premises licence holder. He was designated premises supervisor (DPS) between April 2015 until July 2018.
- A review of the premises licence was launched by West Mercia Police in September 2015 due to two members of staff found working illegally. The current applicant Mikayeel Deen was the licence holder.
- 10. In February 2017, Mikayeel Deen transferred the premises licence to MaryGold Hfd Ltd. Mikayeel Deen remained as the DPS.
- 11. In July 2018, the company MaryGold Hfd Ltd was dissolved. As a consequence the premises licence lapsed.

Summary of Representations

12. Two (2) representations have been received from responsible authorities (Environmental Protection and West Mercia Police). These can be found at appendix 2 and 3 respectively. The applicant has agreed some, but not all of the Environmental Protection conditions. The agreed and not-agreed conditions are summarised at appendix 4.

Community Impact

13. Any decision is unlikely to have any impact on the local community.

Equality duty

- 14. There are no equality issues in relation to the content of this report.
- 15. This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in section 1 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 16. Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

Financial implications

17. There are unlikely to be any financial implications for the authority at this time.

Legal Implications

- 18. As relevant representations have been received, the sub committee must determine the application under Section 3.5.7 (c) of the Herefordshire Council constitution. The representations must relate to the licensing objectives and the sub committee must determine the likely effect of the grant of the premises licences on the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 19. The licensing authority must have regard to the promotion of the four licensing objectives namely; the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm in exercising its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Further regard should be had to the statutory guidance under Section 182 of the Act and the Council's own statement of licensing policy. The options available to the licensing authority are set out in section 1 of this report.
- 20. The sub committee should be aware of a number of stated cases which have appeared before the Administrative Court and are binding on the Licensing Authority.
- 21. The case of Daniel Thwaites Plc v Wirral Borough Magistrates' Court (Case No: CO/5533/2006) at the High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division Administrative Court on 6 May 2008, [2008] EWHC 838 (Admin), 2008 WL 1968943, Before the Honourable Mrs Justice Black.
- 22. In this case it was summed up that: -
 - A licensing authority must have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. Licensing authorities may depart from it if they have reason to do so but will need to give full reasons for their actions.
- 23. Furthermore the Thwaites case established that only conditions should be attached to a licence with a view to promoting the Licensing objectives and that 'real evidence' must be presented to support the reason for imposing these conditions.
- 24. This judgement is further supported in the case of The Queen on the Application of Bristol Council v Bristol Magistrates' Court, CO/6920/2008 High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division The Administrative Court, 24 February 2009, [2009] EWHC 625 (Admin) 2009 WL 648859 in which it was said:
 - 'Licensing authorities should only impose conditions which are necessary and proportionate for the promotion for licensing objectives'.
- 25. In addition to this it was stated that any condition attached to the licence should be an enforceable condition.

Right of Appeal

26. Schedule 5 gives a right of appeal which states:

Decision to grant premises licence or impose conditions etc.

- (1) This paragraph applies where a licensing authority grants a premises licence under section 18.
- (2) The holder of the licence may appeal against any decision—
 - (a) to impose conditions on the licence under subsection (2)(a) or (3)(b) of that section, or
 - (b) to take any step mentioned in subsection (4)(b) or (c) of that section (exclusion of licensable activity or refusal to specify person as premises supervisor).
- (3) Where a person who made relevant representations in relation to the application desires to contend—
 - (a) that the licence ought not to have been granted, or
 - (b) that, on granting the licence, the licensing authority ought to have imposed different or additional conditions, or to have taken a step mentioned in subsection (4)(b) or (c) of that section,

he may appeal against the decision.

- (4) In sub-paragraph (3) "relevant representations" has the meaning given in section 18(6).
- 27. Appeals should be made to the Magistrates Court and must be made within 21 days beginning with the day on which the appellant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision appealed against

Risk Management

28. There is little risk associated with the decision at this time as the legislation allows a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within a period of 21days of being notified of the decision in writing.

CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of EVIDENTIAL QUALITY in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition.

Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits, outside areas, and all areas where the sale/ supply of alcohol occurs.

Equipment MUST be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped recordings MUST be kept in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a period of 31 days and handed to Police on demand.

The Premises Licence Holder or DPS or a person nominated by them in writing for the purpose will employ SIA doorstaff on a risk assessed basis. The risk assessment shall be in writing and shall be made immediately available on request to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police.

An incident log must be kept at the premises, and made immediately available on request to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police which must record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment





West Mercia Police are in receipt of an application for a new premises licence for a premises known as **Marygold**, **Union Street**, **Hereford**. The application is for the sale/supply of alcohol, regulated entertainment and late night refreshment. The applicant seeks to specify the designated premises supervisor as Mikayeel Deen.

West Mercia Police OBJECT to this application.

This premises is within an area that forms part of the special cumulative impact policy of Herefordshire District Council Licensing Policy. The applicant has failed to identify this fact and has failed to put forward comprehensive steps to address the requirements of this policy.

Additionally West Mercia Police are aware that the premises were previously licensed and that its licence lapsed in mid 2018 when the named premises licence holder company was dissolved. Despite this the (same) operators of the premises continued to undertake unlicensed licensable activities up until at least the 18/02/2019. The view of West Mercia Police is that this conduct is irresponsible and undermines the licensing objectives.

West Mercia Police would encourage the applicant to contact the Police to further discuss this application.

 exits to any beer garden, patio area, smoking area or similar, requesting the public to

- Recorded music shall be reduced to background levels after 23.00hrs.
- Live music must stop at 23.00hrs

Recommendation

THAT:

The sub committee determine the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community. They should give appropriate weight to:

- The steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives,
- The representations (including supporting information) presented by all parties,
- The guidance issued to local authorities under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and
- The Herefordshire Council Statement of Licensing Policy 2015 2020.

Options

1. There are a number of options open to the sub-committee:

- a) Grant the licence subject to conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application and the mandatory conditions set out in the Licensing Act 2003,
- b) Grant the licence subject to modified conditions to that of the operating schedule where the sub-committee considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and add mandatory conditions set out in the Licensing Act 2003.
- c) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates
- d) To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premise supervisor, or
- e) To reject the application.

Reasons for Recommendations

2. Ensures compliance with the Licensing Act 2003.

Summary of Application

5. The application (appendix 1) requests to grant a premises licence to allow the following licensable activities, during the hours shown, as follows:

Plays, Films, Live Music, Recorded Music, Performances of Dance, Anything of a Similar Description to Regulated Entertainment (Indoors/Outdoors) Monday-Sunday 10:00-24:00

Late Night Refreshment (Indoors/Outdoors) Monday-Sunday 23:00-24:00 Sale/Supply of Alcohol (for consumption on and off the premises). Monday – Sunday 12:00 – 24:00

Premises History

- 6. To date, the licensing authority has received eight (8) Temporary Event Notices (TENS) (four in 2018 and four in 2019) all submitted by Lynn Jones. Seven (7) of the notices were granted by the Licensing Authority. In 2018, one TEN was not granted due to the applicant using her allowance as she was a non-personal licence holder at the time.
- 7. Both West Mercia Police and Environmental Protection received copies of the TENs and were consulted, as they are the only representees who can object, no objection was received from either concerning these TENS.

Summary of Representations

- 8. Three (3) representations have been received from the responsible authorities (Environmental Protection, West Mercia Police and Trading Standards). These can be found from appendix 2 to 4 respectively. The applicant has agreed the Environmental Protection representation (appendix 2).
- 9. One (1) public representation has been accepted by the local authority as being relevant. This can be found at appendix 5.
- 10. One (1) further public representation have been received by the local authority but was rejected due to it being not relevant.

Community Impact

11. Any decision is unlikely to have any impact on the local community.

Equality duty

- 12. There are no equality issues in relation to the content of this report.
- 13. This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in section 1 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 14. Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

Financial implications

15. There are unlikely to be any financial implications for the authority at this time.

Legal Implications

- 16. As relevant representations have been received, the sub committee must determine the application under Section 3.5.7 (c) of the Herefordshire Council constitution. The representations must relate to the licensing objectives and the sub committee must determine the likely effect of the grant of the premises licences on the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 17. The licensing authority must have regard to the promotion of the four licensing objectives namely; the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm in exercising its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Further regard should be had to the statutory guidance under Section 182 of the Act and the Council's own statement of licensing policy. The options available to the licensing authority are set out in section 1 of this report.
- 18. The sub committee should be aware of a number of stated cases which have appeared before the Administrative Court and are binding on the Licensing Authority.
- 19. The case of Daniel Thwaites Plc v Wirral Borough Magistrates' Court (Case No: CO/5533/2006) at the High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division Administrative Court on 6 May 2008, [2008] EWHC 838 (Admin), 2008 WL 1968943, Before the Honourable Mrs Justice Black.
- 20. In this case it was summed up that: -
 - A licensing authority must have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. Licensing authorities may depart from it if they have reason to do so but will need to give full reasons for their actions.
- 21. Furthermore the Thwaites case established that only conditions should be attached to a licence with a view to promoting the Licensing objectives and that 'real evidence' must be presented to support the reason for imposing these conditions.
- 22. This judgement is further supported in the case of The Queen on the Application of Bristol Council v Bristol Magistrates' Court, CO/6920/2008 High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division The Administrative Court, 24 February 2009, [2009] EWHC 625 (Admin) 2009 WL 648859 in which it was said:
 - 'Licensing authorities should only impose conditions which are necessary and proportionate for the promotion for licensing objectives'.
- 23. In addition to this it was stated that any condition attached to the licence should be an enforceable condition.

Right of Appeal

24. Schedule 5 gives a right of appeal which states:

Decision to grant premises licence or impose conditions etc.

- (1) This paragraph applies where a licensing authority grants a premises licence under section 18.
- (2) The holder of the licence may appeal against any decision—
 - (a) to impose conditions on the licence under subsection (2)(a) or (3)(b)

- of that section, or
- (b) to take any step mentioned in subsection (4)(b) or (c) of that section (exclusion of licensable activity or refusal to specify person as premises supervisor).
- (3) Where a person who made relevant representations in relation to the application desires to contend—
 - (a) that the licence ought not to have been granted, or
 - (b) that, on granting the licence, the licensing authority ought to have imposed different or additional conditions, or to have taken a step mentioned in subsection (4)(b) or (c) of that section,

he may appeal against the decision.

- (4) In sub-paragraph (3) "relevant representations" has the meaning given in section 18(6).
- 25. Appeals should be made to the Magistrates Court and must be made within 21 days beginning with the day on which the appellant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision appealed against

Risk Management

26. There is little risk associated with the decision at this time as the legislation allows a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within a period of 21days of being notified of the decision in writing.

List here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.

We have run about 10 events last summer at the poetry festival and H Art week. We were absolutely vigilant about any disruptive behaviour especially at closing time and when clients were leaving the venue. We had no complaints from local people, and there were no hints of anything disruptive. The atmosphere was always respectful and calm. The public were greeted at the door. We always served and will continue to serve tea, coffee, soft drinks and food, and the onus was on local ales, cider and wines rather than spirits.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

My staff will be given strict instructions not to serve anyone who is drunk. I will always make sure there are enough staff so problems are easy to deal with. We obviously will be vigilant with anything that could cause a problem including drugs, violence, and anything that could cause the nearest neighbours to complain. We know and understand the area and that includes other pubs. We do not want to be associated with the rowdy football scene. The staff will be instructed to always use the legal measurements when serving. There will always be plenty of other options to alcohol available. The Barn will always kept clear of bottles and empty glasses.

c) Public safety

We will maintain a strict observation on clientelle and anything that looks like it might get out of hand will be nipped in the bud to maintain the safety of the public. There will be a strict watchful eye to make sure noone tries to drive home if they have had to much alcohol to drink. Staff will be shown the ways to tackle a rowdy group by demonstrating how to detach a trouble maker from the rest of the group and also how to depersonalize a refusal to serve someone by reference to the law.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Excessive drinking will always be discouraged. If we suspect that there might be a problem we will install CCTV cameras but based on the previous events I suspect that we will not have anything to cause a public nuisance. Any person who is drunk and attempts to enter the venue will be prevented from doing so. At closing time the clientele will be supervised as they leave to make sure that any merriment does not cause a nuisance. We will always stick to last orders and the end of the night timings.

e) The protection of children from harm

Any children will always be protected but evenings will be mainly adults so I really do not see a problem here. The bar staff will constantly be assessing younger looking clientele and any who look 25 or younger will be asked to provide ID. The bar area will have a picture of the cards that are genuine according to the Proof of Age Standards Scheme for the staff to refer to. Also the music will never be loud enough to damage anyone's ears including children's.

- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.

- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, **less than 6 months old**, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.



West Mercia Police are in receipt of an application for a new premises licence for a venue to be known as St Katherines Barn, Ledbury The application is for the sale/supply of alcohol. The applicant seeks to specify the designated premises supervisor as Lynn Jones - however it is understood that at this time she does not hold a personal licence.

West Mercia Police do not object to this application.

The applicant has put forward a series of statements to promote the licensing objectives, it is our view that these are not enforceable.

Therefore West Mercia Police has the following representations for steps to promote the licensing objectives:

- 1. An incident log must be kept at the premises. Incident log records will be retained for a period of 12 months from the date it occurred. It will made immediately available on request to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or the Police, which must record the following:
- (a) all crimes (relevant to the licensing objectives) reported to the venue
- (b) any complaints (relevant to the licensing objectives) received
- (c) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (e) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 2. All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in Responsible Alcohol Retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any other training recognised and agreed with Trading Standards. (All existing staff shall be trained within one month of the date that this condition appears on this licence. All new staff shall be trained within one month of taking up employment. All staff shall be re-trained twelve monthly thereafter. Training records shall be kept on the premises which shall show the name of the training course attended, the date of the training, the name of the person undertaking the training and shall be produced to the police, an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) on demand
- 3. The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 Policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand of an authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or the police. Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any serving counter advertising the scheme operated.

These are the minimuym conditions West Mercia Police would wish to see applied to any premises licence granted to this location.

As an authorised body under the Licensing Act 2003, Herefordshire Council Environmental Health and Trading Standards have received details of your application for a premises licence for St Katherine's Barn, St Katherine's, Ledbury, Herefordshire HR8 1EA

Trading Standards have the responsibility for enforcing the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of sales of alcohol to anyone under the age of eighteen.

After looking at your application under the section protection of children from harm we would seek to include the following conditions on the premises licence in addition to those already specified on the application:

- 1. All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any equivalent training course within 1 month of commencing employment at the premises. Where there are existing staff this training shall be completed within 3 months of the date that this condition first appears on the licence. No person shall be authorised to sell or supply alcohol until this training is completed. Refresher training will be conducted at 12 monthly intervals. Training records shall be kept on the premises and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.
- 2. A written or electronic register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable to provide required identification to prove their age. Such records shall be kept for a period of 12 months. It will be collected and reviewed on a weekly basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.
- 3. The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 Policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand of the Police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council. Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any sale area advertising the scheme operated.

Dear Sir or Madam

I am writing with regards to The Barn that is situated in St. Katherine's car park in Ledbury.

I believe that the owners wish to serve drinks up until 12 a.m. and are currently in the process of applying for a license that will enable them to do so.

I cannot express my concern about this enough.

If the application is successful then this will cause further disturbance to people living in that area, in to the early hours of the morning.

I already experience noise disturbance from live music events at The Barn. I am also subjected to the disturbances caused by customers drinking outside the venue,

This continues after the music has stopped and into the early hours. When the venue has closed I then experience further noise from the premises being locked up.

I have had to tolerate this ever since The Barn opened.

I am dismayed at the possibility of a late night licence being granted and dread what further disturbances will occur and at a later hour. This will have such a detrimental affect, especially as I have to be up early for work on Saturday mornings.

Only recently I experienced loud live music on both Friday and Saturday night. From 7.30 p.m.live music was played passed the expected finishing time of 11 p.m. The music was and is so loud that I am unable to relax and watch and hear my own television, or listen to my own music in my own home. On the Friday night of that weekend, the time that the last person left the premises was 1.30 a.m.

I dread to think how much disturbance I will experience come the summer when I will need to open my windows.

St. Katherines car park is a quiet area so any noise late at night is very noticeable.

I have already experienced much disturbance and disruption ever since renovation work on The Barn began, over a year ago. Often seven days a week and more than 8 hours a day.

I'm sure some local people are excited about Ledbury having a venue to hold such events and may look forward to late night drinking. I appreciate this, I would be very grateful if you would consider my concerns that are also shared by others in the vicinity of The Barn.

- b) Grant the licence subject to modified conditions to that of the operating schedule where the sub-committee considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and add mandatory conditions set out in the Licensing Act 2003.
- c) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates
- d) To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premise supervisor, or
- e) To reject the application.

Reasons for Recommendations

2. Ensures compliance with the Licensing Act 2003.

Summary of Application

5. The application (appendix 1) requests to grant a premises licence to allow the following licensable activities, during the hours shown, as follows:

Sale/Supply of Alcohol (for consumption off the premises) Friday – Sunday 11:00 – 22:00 From March through to October (inclusive) annually.

Summary of Representations

6. Two (2) representations have been received from the responsible authorities (West

- Mercia Police and Trading Standards). These can be found at appendices 2 and 3 respectively. The applicant has agreed to these representations.
- 7. One (1) public representation has been accepted by the local authority as being relevant. This can be found at appendix 4.

Community Impact

8. Any decision is unlikely to have any impact on the local community.

Equality duty

- 9. There are no equality issues in relation to the content of this report.
- 10. This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in section 1 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 11. Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

Financial implications

12. There are unlikely to be any financial implications for the authority at this time.

Legal Implications

- 13. As relevant representations have been received, the sub committee must determine the application under Section 3.5.7 (c) of the Herefordshire Council constitution. The representations must relate to the licensing objectives and the sub committee must determine the likely effect of the grant of the premises licences on the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 14. The licensing authority must have regard to the promotion of the four licensing objectives namely; the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm in exercising its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Further regard should be had to the statutory guidance under Section 182 of the Act and the Council's own statement of licensing policy. The options available to the licensing authority are set out in section 1 of this report.
- 15. The sub committee should be aware of a number of stated cases which have appeared before the Administrative Court and are binding on the Licensing Authority.
- 16. The case of Daniel Thwaites Plc v Wirral Borough Magistrates' Court (Case No: CO/5533/2006) at the High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division Administrative

Court on 6 May 2008, [2008] EWHC 838 (Admin), 2008 WL 1968943, Before the Honourable Mrs Justice Black. In this case it was summed up that: -

A licensing authority must have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. Licensing authorities may depart from it if they have reason to do so but will need to give full reasons for their actions.

- 17. Furthermore the Thwaites case established that only conditions should be attached to a licence with a view to promoting the Licensing objectives and that 'real evidence' must be presented to support the reason for imposing these conditions.
- 18. This judgement is further supported in the case of The Queen on the Application of Bristol Council v Bristol Magistrates' Court, CO/6920/2008 High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division The Administrative Court, 24 February 2009, [2009] EWHC 625 (Admin) 2009 WL 648859 in which it was said:
 - 'Licensing authorities should only impose conditions which are necessary and proportionate for the promotion for licensing objectives'.
- 19. In addition to this it was stated that any condition attached to the licence should be an enforceable condition.

Right of Appeal

20. Schedule 5 gives a right of appeal which states:

Decision to grant premises licence or impose conditions etc.

- (1) This paragraph applies where a licensing authority grants a premises licence under section 18.
- (2) The holder of the licence may appeal against any decision—
 - (a) to impose conditions on the licence under subsection (2)(a) or (3)(b) of that section, or
 - (b) to take any step mentioned in subsection (4)(b) or (c) of that section (exclusion of licensable activity or refusal to specify person as premises supervisor).
- (3) Where a person who made relevant representations in relation to the application desires to contend—
 - (a) that the licence ought not to have been granted, or
 - (b) that, on granting the licence, the licensing authority ought to have imposed different or additional conditions, or to have taken a step mentioned in subsection (4)(b) or (c) of that section,

he may appeal against the decision.

- (4) In sub-paragraph (3) "relevant representations" has the meaning given in section 18(6).
- 21. Appeals should be made to the Magistrates Court and must be made within 21 days beginning with the day on which the appellant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision appealed against.

Risk Management

22. There is little risk associated with the decision at this time as the legislation allows a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within a period of 21days of being notified of the decision in writing.



- 1. An incident log must be kept at the premises. Incident log records will be retained for a period of 12 months from the date it occurred. It will made immediately available on request to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or the Police, which must record the following:
- (i) all crimes (relevant to the licensing objectives) reported to the venue
- (ii) any complaints (relevant to the licensing objectives) received
- (iii) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (iv) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 2. All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in Responsible Alcohol Retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any other training recognised and agreed by Herefordshire Council Trading Standards . (All existing staff shall be trained within one month of the date that this condition appears on this licence. All new staff shall be trained within one month of taking up employment. All staff shall be re-trained twelve monthly thereafter. Training records shall be kept on the premises which shall show the name of the training course attended, the date of the training, the name of the person undertaking the training and shall be produced to the police, an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) on demand
- 3. The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 Policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand of an authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or the police. Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any serving counter advertising the scheme operated.

These are the minimum conditions West Mercia Police would wish to see applied to any premises licence granted to this location.

As an authorised body under the Licensing Act 2003, Herefordshire Council Environmental Health and Trading Standards have received details of your application for a premises licence for Meredith Farm Campsite, Llancloudy, Herefordshire, HR2 8QN.

Trading Standards have the responsibility for enforcing the Licensing Act 2003 in respect of sales of alcohol to anyone under the age of eighteen.

After looking at your application under the section protection of children from harm we would seek to include the following conditions on the premises licence in addition to those already specified on the application:

- 1. All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any equivalent training course within 1 month of commencing employment at the premises. Where there are existing staff this training shall be completed within 3 months of the date that this condition first appears on the licence. No person shall be authorised to sell or supply alcohol until this training is completed. Refresher training will be conducted at 12 monthly intervals. Training records shall be kept on the premises and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.
- 2. A written or electronic register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable to provide required identification to prove their age. Such records shall be kept for a period of 12 months. It will be collected and reviewed on a weekly basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.
- 3. The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 Policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand of the Police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council. Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any sale area advertising the scheme operated.


