Members of the Licensing Panel of the Council's Regulatory Committee considered the above application, full details of which appeared before the Members in their agenda and the background papers.

Prior to making their decision, the Members heard from Mr Mazzocchi, the applicant, together with Miss Woodland, the Environmental Health Officer.

Having carefully considered those matters brought before them, the Committee were of the opinion that the application should be **granted subject** to the conditions below. In reaching their decision, the Members had full regard to the representations (including supporting information) presented by all parties, the guidance issued to local authorities under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, the Herefordshire Council Licensing Policy and the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The Members imposed conditions in order to promote the four licensing objectives, namely the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.

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#### CONDITIONS

The application was granted in respect of the hours of operation of the licensable activities described in the box above together with the following conditions

- The mandatory conditions of The Licensing Act 2003.
- All conditions offered by the applicant under section P of the application form.

#### PUBLIC SAFETY

- The internal and external arrangements of the premises (including the layout, fittings, installations and other items in connection with public areas) hereby licensed shall remain as detailed in the plans submitted to and approved by the Licensing Authority.
- A suitable and sufficient risk assessment for all licensed areas, shall be recorded and maintained. Adequate systems shall be in place to ensure that actions (and precautions) identified in the risk assessment shall be effectively implemented.
- The premises shall be adequately ventilated whilst open to the general public.
- No open bottles or containers shall be removed from the premises.
- Adequate systems shall be in place to control numbers of persons entering the premises to prevent overcrowding and alleviate crowd control problems.
- All parts of the premises shall be provided with adequate illumination whilst the premises are being used for any licensable activities. All routes of escape and all parts of the premises to which the public have access shall be provided with adequate and assured lighting from two independent supplies and systems.
- A current inspection certificate shall be held for all electrical installations in accordance with BS 7671 and BS 5266-1.
- All portable electrical equipment, such as amplifiers, shall be powered through a suitable earth sensitive leakage system (Residual Current Device).

#### PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

- Music entertainment provided on the premises shall be maintained at background levels only and shall not be audible beyond the boundary of the premises.
- The use of the premises shall be restricted to that of a restaurant and pre-booked function/events.

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- The licensee shall ensure that any lighting provided on, or illumination effects emitted from, the premises does not cause interference with the use of any neighbouring properties.

**PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM**

- Staff should ensure sight of evidence of age from any person appearing to those engaged in selling or supplying alcohol to be under the age of 18 and who is attempting to buy alcohol.
- No person under the age of 18 years old shall be allowed to serve alcohol within the premises without the written permission of the Council.
