

Revenue Budget 2016/17 - Proposed Amendments

Attached is a further proposed amendment to the revenue budget:

Amendment 3 – Conservative Group

That £60k be removed from the energy cost budget to support library, museum and heritage services.

The amendments will be debated following the proposing and seconding of the Cabinet's budget proposals and will be voted on in turn.

If approved the amended budget will be the substantive budget Council then vote on.

The Local Government Finance Act 1992 requires council to set a balanced budget.

Approval of the amendments moves a budget allocation from one budget heading to another; it does not change policy or authorise the activity which the budget amendment seeks to support. This is the function of Cabinet which will receive reports on the items before making a decision to implement any change in policy. This enables consultation with affected groups.
