Decision made	THAT: (a) A public path diversion order, for definitive footpath LO6 in the parish of Llanrothal and GW27A in the parish of Garway, is made in accordance with section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 and concurrent public path extinguishment order, for definitive footpath LO3 in the parish of Llanrothal is made in accordance with section 118 of the Highways Act 1980 as shown in the draft order and plan D475iii/243-6 in the Appendix to this report. It has no duty to do so. The Council could therefore reject the application on the grounds that it does not contribute sufficiently to the wider ambitions and priorities of the Council.
