Decision made:	Award a contract to Carers Trust 4All for the provision of a carers service for a period of 5 years at a total cost of £800k.			
Reasons for decision:	A newly designed carers service is required to align the delivery of carers services to carers in Herefordshire to the Joint Carers Strategy 2017 – 2021. A fully competitive tender process has been undertaken to identify a provider to deliver this service for a period of five years, starting on the 1st April 2019. Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:	Finance Funding for the carers service is already approved as part of the adult and communities budget. Health and safety The commissioned provider will be expected to work to the same health and safety standards and codes of practice as the council, as far as is reasonably practicable. If there were to be no service for carers then older people, women and those with a disability would be at particular risk of a negative impact on their wellbeing. Legal
