Consultation:	Members were consulted during the Passenger Transport Review reported to Cabinet in April 2017 which set out the approach to the provision of services for public, education and special needs transport.
Decision made:	The decision has been taken to: 1. Award SEN Transport contract numbers NS538S, BC175S, NS159S, and MSH94S as follows:
	Contract NS538S – New Star College. Awarded to Blue Line Taxis for a 9 month term commencing 2 nd November 2018 at an annual value of £3,800. 1 Compliant bid was received. This is an additional contract required to provide transport for a post 19 SEN student in accordance with DfE guidance.
	Contract BC175S – Barrs Court School. Awarded to CM Davies for a 5 year term commencing 19 th November 2018 at an annual value of £32,300. 3 Compliant bids were received. This contract replaces a Herefordshire Council operated service achieving an annual saving of £7,326.
	NS159S - New Star College. Awarded to Blue Line Taxis for a 1 month period commencing 16 th November 2018 at an annual value of £2,200. 1 Compliant bid was received. This is an additional

	contract required to provide transport for a post 19 SEN student in accordance with DfE guidance. MSH94S – Marlowe School. Awarded to Blue Line Taxis for an 8
	month period commencing 22 nd November 2018 at an annual value of £15,200. 1 Compliant bid was received. This is an additional contract required to provide statutory free transport to an SEN
	student.
	The net effect of awarding these contracts is an increase in contracting costs for SEN transport of £11,100 per annum.
Reasons for decision:	To ensure that the council manages its transport services effectively whilst also meeting its statutory duties and ensures children are transported to school in line with eligibility.
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:	The Passenger Transport Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS) complies fully with current procurement legislation, the Councils contract procedure rules, and established best practice. Applicants to join the
considerations.	DPS have to complete a thorough evaluation questionnaire which is then checked for compliance by Passenger Transport and
	Commercial Services. Applicants are only allowed to join the DPS if they meet all of the specified criteria. The e-portal used to carry out tendering exercises under the DPS ensures that contracts are
	securely advertised to all qualifying parties. The Passenger Transport DPS ensures that contracts are awarded fairly and transparently
	based on specified evaluation criteria. Selection questionnaires, contract specifications and conditions of contract have been written in consultation with legal and commercial services.
