Decision title:	Preparation of a Temporary Speed Restriction Order made under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended).

Decision made:	To authorise the making of a Temporary Speed Restriction Order served under Section 16A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act to require the temporary speed restriction of the following roads in Bromyard <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. A465, Bromyard from the existing 30 mph North of Panniers Lane to approximately 250 m South of Cooper's Green at a maximum speed of 30 mph (364656/254039, 364303/253221). ii. B4214, Bromyard, from the junction with the A465 to Burgess Farm at a maximum speed of 30 mph (364399/253453, 364095,252336). <p>The order shall come into effect on 28th June 2019 And is planned to be in effect for 3 days.</p>
Reasons for decision:	To enable the Bromyard Gala to manage the safety of highway users, for which purpose the Council, as highway authority, consider the speed restriction on the road is required due to the likelihood of danger to highway users while the said event is taking place.
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:	Local disruption on highway network which will be managed by the event organiser and appropriate signage.
Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	Not to introduce a temporary speed restriction of the road; but there would then be operational difficulties in the said event taking place, and/or would result in a longer period of disruption. In addition, there would be a greater risk to users of

	the highway and possible claims against the highway authority as a result
