Reasons for decision:	St Francis Xaver's RC Primary is a popular and successful faith school	
	with a diversity of cultures, pupils and abilities serving the local	
	community.	
	Pupil numbers at the school have been consistent in recent years	
	with the school filling to capacity.	
	The school is proposing to construct a small extension to the rear of	
	the library and IT rooms to provide a much needed learning space	
	with a nurture room for supporting vulnerable families in the school	
	community.	
	There is an ever increasing demand in the school for early help	
	assessment to support the mental well-being of their families. If this	
	support can be accessed early on, the impact on learning for pupils	
	is significant. The nurture room will enable parents to meet the	
	family support worker, in confidence, to discuss problematic issues	
	and plan next steps to move forward. The nurture room will then	
	provide space for pupils to undertake interventions supporting their	
	well-being reinforcing positive behavior.	
	The school also needs additional intervention areas for small group	
	teaching enhancing communication and language skills that	
	significantly impact upon the life chances of children. Currently	
	children are taught in the hall and other open spaces which are not	
	as suitable as children become distracted with interruptions. Small	

areas with better sound proofing would enable children to learn at a faster rate impacting on higher standards and outcomes.

The learning zone will also include an area for meditation which would equally enhance well-being of both pupils and staff. As a faith school, the importance of prayer should never be underestimated.

The provision of a storage area to clear equipment from the hall would make the working space safer for the learning environment. The hall would consequently have more space and children could access a larger area for their physical needs during PE and fitness sessions.

The extension would also allow the re-modelling of existing space to improve the facilities, extending the provision of the non-core curriculum areas, including design and technology.

S106 contributions have been secured towards St Francis Xavier's RC Primary School. This contribution along with schools own devolved formula capital (DFC) and revenue funding will be made available to deliver the necessary works required for the school.

Costs for the works have been calculated as:

If the proposed works are not undertaken there is a risk that children will not have access to the full curriculum and that avoidable accidents involving children, parents or staff could occur if the hall continues to be used as a dual use space.

Details of any alternative Consideration was given to the installation of a separate stand-alone building to provide an additional space. The costing for this scheme was considered prohibitive and as there was no other funding stream that could be utilised, it was dismissed as unaffordable.
