Consultation:	The better care partnership group, contracts and commissioning board and joint commissioning board have received regular updates in relation to this scheme and support the suggested allocation for 2019/20.			
Decision made:	The director for adults and communities agrees the spending allocation for the Falls Care Navigator service from 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020 at a total cost of £44,000			
	April – September 2019 funding is secured via the iBCF funding allocation. The remaining funding, to March 2020, has been secured via the local authority public health grant.			
Reasons for decision:	The overall aim of the scheme is to establish a proactive coordinator role within the existing falls responder service to work specifically with repeat fallers to maintain independence and minimise the likelihood and impact of future falls. Funding is used to employ 1.5 WTE staff members to deliver a targeted response to a group of vulnerable individuals who previously relied on emergency or crisis response services. Employed by Connexus Group, the care navigators undertake face-to-face follow up interventions with repeat fallers, linking them with relevant community support opportunities and establishing an individual management plan to mitigate the risk of future repeat falls and significant harm.
