What are the aims or main purpose of the service, function or policy? What does it provide and how does it provide it?

Section 17(1) of the Children Act 1989 states that it shall be the general duty of every local authority: to safeguard and promote the welfare of children within their area who are in need. The duty continues during out of office hours.

The Emergency Duty Team service (EDT) exists to provide an emergency responsive service for children and young people believed to be at risk of significant harm and for whom delay until the next working day would be detrimental to their welfare and safety. The service ensures that they continue to be safeguarded in the immediate term.

Children and young people are safeguarded by the out of hours service by addressing statutory emergencies that cannot be safely left until the following working day, including:

- a. Child Protection assessments S47 of the 1989 Children Act (including strategy discussion/meetings)
- b. Emergency Child in Need Assessments S17 of the 1989 Children Act
- c. Investigation of the need to provide services for a child in need
- d. Investigation of the need to accommodate a child
- e. Investigation of the need for an emergency protection order
- f. Emergency assessments under the NHS & Community Care Act 1990
- g. Request from police for a joint visit
- h. Coordinate and provide information for SUDIC (Sudden Unexpected Death In Infants And Children)

The current EDT service has been delivered by Worcestershire County Council since 1997, when Herefordshire and Worcestershire became individual authorities. However formal notification of Worcestershire County Council's intention to transfer their children's services

to Worcestershire Children First from 1 October 2019, has been received by Herefordshire Council.

Worcestershire Children First is a 'not for profit' company and wholly owned by Worcestershire County Council. It will be operationally independent and have a single focus on children and young people.

To ensure continuity of this critical service the intention is to terminate the current contract with Worcestershire County Council from 30 September 2019 and award a new contract to Worcestershire Children First from 1 October 2019.

Herefordshire Council has been satisfied with the quality and responsiveness of the EDT service provided by Worcestershire County Council. The transfer of the operational EDT from Worcestershire County Council to Worcestershire Children First is not anticipated to have any negative impact. There will continue to be clear operational protocols in place between Herefordshire Council and EDT and any emerging issues will be addressed through regular contract management meetings and quarterly submission of performance data.

There are no concerns that the new arrangements will negatively impact on any group, individual or service provision. There have been no complaints received relating to the current service, which will continue to be operated and managed by same staff.

C) Information

What information (monitoring or consultation data) have you got and what is it telling you?

There are approximately 36,000 under 18 year olds in the county out of a population of 189,000 (2016 estimate).

Monitoring data shows the service continues to address the needs of those children and young people it is responsible for and that numbers of contacts have remained the steady over the three year period of the contract.

During the period April 2017 to March 2019, the service dealt with an average of 104 contacts with safeguarding cases per month. Most referrals to the service come from care providers (children's homes and fostering agencies), the police, or are anonymous. The most common reasons for contacting the service are to sharing information/ accessing advice or report a missing child. Most cases are dealt with through telephone consultation, and when necessary, the service will arrange for a social worker to undertake an emergency site visit.
