Decision made:	 To increase the allocation of budget available for upgrading office lighting to energy efficient LED lighting fitted with advanced controls. Authority to spend budget increased by £8,500 from £87,820 to £96,320.
Reasons for decision:	 The decision for 'Energy Efficiency in Corporate Estate' was passed on 11th March 2019. https://councillors.herefordshire.gov.uk/ieDecisionDetails.aspx?ID=5769 The decision enabled energy efficiency measures to be installed throughout the corporate estate and the use of 'Sustainable Energy in Public Buildings' grant monies. Subsequent to the approved decision the requirement for an additional £8,500 has been identified for LED lighting and advanced controls at the Museum Resource and Learning Centre. This supplemental cost is in addition to the existing allocated budget for Energy and Office lighting - £87,820. The additional budget is required to include the addition of advanced controls which will save further energy and carbon over the existing LED only proposal.
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:	 The additional costs of £8,500 can be met within the existing approved budget and continues to demonstrate value for money. Works are procured through the ProContract portal in line with European procurement law. The additional environmental benefits contribute to the Council's commitment to achieve carbon neutrality, represent best value and enable a better working environment for council staff and visitors to the building. The installation will be project managed by the Property Services team to ensure compliance with all relevant regulations.
Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	 By continuing with business as usual the revenue savings and associated carbon reduction would not be realised. Should Herefordshire Council not utilise the ERDF funds through the Sustainable Energy in Public Buildings project the Council would be reliant on ad-hoc capital loans to deliver energy retro-fit projects. Due to reductions in public sector budgets and renewable energy/energy efficiency subsidies this is becoming increasingly difficult to justify from a business perspective.
