Reasons for decision:

The councils charging principles aim to charge for all services where it is appropriate to do so, unless there are conflicting policies or legal reasons not to do so and aim to maximise income from fees and charges by ensuring that charges reflect the full cost of provision, unless there are contrary policies, legal or contractual reasons. Contractor costs charged to the council for the delivery of the services included above have increased with inflation therefore it is necessary to increase charges in order to recover these costs. Charges for trade waste and bulky collections have been compared with neighbouring authorities in Worcestershire and are comparable.
