I would like clarification on "Limited Waiting"
1. What does it actually mean?

- 2. Is there a specified time?
- 3. Is there a restriction on return?
- 4. I ask because I have been told that the Nursery management is suggesting that it will not be a problem because cars could just be moved down the street to accommodate the specified time. Defeats the object of whole plan.
- 5. The restricted a parking also could allow parking on both sides of the road quite legally and this again would defeat the object of the plan. The bus would still have to negotiate between legally parked cars.

## Also: -

- 1. Should the double yellow lines also be applied at the junction with Ledbury Road? Parking on this junction is often a problem now with Tesco customers especially. Nothing is shown on your plan. Double yellow lines here would be consistent with other junctions onto Lichfield Avenue.
- 2. Will the parking become part of patrolled enforcement scheme?

Basically, I support a plan that will improve the flow, reduce inconvenience and improve general safety. I think the width of the road should be considered if cars are parked on both sides especially for any extended period.

The objectives of the plan are good however detail requires some more thought.

Following your letter about the Traffic Scheme in Lichfield Avenue asking for any responses. I understand there has been a problem where buses have sometimes had problems coming through Lichfield Avenue as not enough space where cars parked both sides of road. I live at No Lichfield Avenue and there is not an issue in this area of the avenue where cars only park one side of road. The problem, if three is one, seems to be at the at the other end of the Avenue where the Vets and Nursery have customer traffic but no parking space causing additional parking in road.

I understand there is considerable space at Nursery but this for whatever reason is not used. If that is correct could this, the root of problem, not be addressed rather than bringing into force a traffic scheme that effects entire avenue the majority of which takes consideration when parking and where there is as far as i can see no problem?

I've attached photo just taken at 12.20 which happens to be on a Monday which shows Avenue from No 1 upwards. I think this makes clear my point.



REF parking definition, thanks for reply. I can see it can work. I would like to think that No Parking (Double Yellow) could be established at the Ledbury Road end. I am at the other end of the street so not directly affected. However, it would go a long way to improve safety by improving disability for drivers and especially pedestrians. It is a busy junction because of access to Lichfield Avenue and the Tesco store. Traffic is heavy because Ledbury road is a main road and the Tesco store and petrol station is very popular. There is often a lot of short-term parking right on the corner and associated pavement by the Store customers often without any consideration for anyone. It would relieve problems I encounter very often when returning Home.

<u>Proposed Residents Parking Zone – Lichfield Avenue Hereford</u>

Having received the Council's proposal, we are in favour. However, we have the following presumptions and observations.

1. Having spoken to Will, we understand limited waiting actually means no waiting at all between the stated times. We support fully.

- 2. We can't understand why there is a break in the single yellow line (red on map) round the corner of numbers 71-77. This is used as a vital turning area.
- 3. We don't understand why there are not double yellow lines at the Ledbury Rd end to match the other end. This is exactly where accidents are just missed most days as vehicles turn blind into the road from the roundabout side and are often presented with vehicles blocking access causing immediate veering onto the other side of the road.

We thank you for taking notice of our concerns and acting upon them.

We have received proposals for a resident's parking scheme in Lichfield Avenue.

The scheme should address the problem of disorganised commuter parking during the week causing problems for the bus company.

We have two concerns which may already have been addressed.

- 1) Presently cars tend to park over the pavement and there is just room left on the road for a car/bus to pass. This will not be the case if parking bays are used. Therefore, some consideration will need to be given to ensure that some "passing places" are provided for.
- 2) The plan does not show any parking restrictions on the outer side of the 90deg bend. This seems to be an anomaly and would it be better to continue the Limited Waiting lines around the corner, or at least up to the "turning area".

I refer to the above Order and I would like to thank yourselves and for working so hard on the above proposed scheme.

I have tried for a number of years to try to get something done about the parking of vehicles in Lichfield Avenue particularly because of the problems with buses ambulances and fire engines not being able to access properties in the Avenue.

	We are writing to respond to the revised Traffic Regulation Order Scheme:
	1. We understood that there was going to be double yellow lines at the bottom of Lichfield Avenue when approaching from Ledbury Road. We feel this is essential because if cars are allowed to park on both sides of the road (as currently shown on your map as dotted blue) than any cars turning into Lichfield Avenue from the Ledbury Road meeting oncoming traffic - which would be in the middle of the road - will cause problems. Can you kindly confirm that double yellow lines were intended in this area?  2. Whilst we had reservations initially regarding yellow lines outside our property, we were pleased to read we would be eligible for parking permits. However, we had understood that this would enable us (or any visitors) to park outside our property. But we now understand that residents parking (as shown as dotted blue) will be the opposite side of the road in our case. therefore if at any time we wish to leave our car off the drive, or have visitors we will be forced to park elsewhere in the road between the hours of 0800 and 1700. We are not happy with this; however, we do appreciate that this was unavoidable.  We await the next stage in the procedure.  Hi Will
	Further to our conversation on the above proposal, just to confirm that I fully support it.

It will clear the road for Emergency vehicles, public services (bin collection), bus services, and allow for residents and visitors (whether relatives, carers, taxi service, BT engineers, gardeners and so on) to park within reasonable distance of the owner's property, returning Lichfield Avenue to a normal residential area rather than an abused city carpark.

As previously mentioned, Beech House nursery is the worst offender with cars parked as long as 12 hours at a time, as the owner will not allow his staff to park within the large carpark of the premises.

I would like to point out that how I read/understood the letter of July 2019, that the attached was the final plan that was being actioned, so there was nothing more for me to do.
However, my neighbour recently suggested this was not so, that I should be making my 'comments' known to an email address, so hence my email to you. But it is still not clear from your reply, at what stage this plane is at.

I have off road parking so the planned parking restrictions do not affect me or my property. However, I do sympathize with the scheme, especially nearer BrookField Vets which can be an obstacle cause at times. I have also noticed the occasional long term 'non-local' car/van being parked on the road near to my house. Although this is a perfectly legal practice, I do feel the local community is being taken advantage of. Regards I think what I have already said sums up where I am at with this proposal. I commute to to work, but my main transport into Hereford is by push bike, so my perspective may be a little different to others. However, my only other observation is that as the City of Herford increases in size, Lichfield Avenue could well become a haven for day time parking, so the sooner parking restrictions are in place the better. With reference to the proposed parking scheme on Lichfield Average it is with much relief that something will at last be done to stop Lichfield Avenue being a free all-day car park for non-residents. - 4) When friends or relatives call, they have to park quite a way up the avenue, thus parking outside someone else's house.
- 5) When entering our drive, we have to stop on the wrong side of the road to reverse in, often impeding cars driving up or down the avenue.
- 6) Lastly, we have often had cars park outside our house for up to a week or more.

We would very much welcome permit parking, as it would, once again, enable Lichfield Avenue to become a nice residential Avenue and not a free car park for one and all,

Have recently received proposals for parking restrictions in Lichfield avenue.

Can you confirm that the annual cost of three permits will be £30 pound as mentioned in the proposal? Having discussed this with the council they say the costs will be higher.

Can you advise who will pay costs of permits for wellbeing assistant parking. My wife has two carers in the morning which means two cars, this could potentially be three cars if the district nurse arrives at the same time, which did occur recently. She also has one carer in the evening.

I currently have three vehicles registered at my property.

Will you please reply to this as I didn't receive a response to my previous email to you?

Thanks for your reply to my email of 22 October. This email is to say I support the proposals put forward for traffic regulation on Lichfield Avenue, as outlined in the recent leaflet. Lichfield Avenue, dated September, 2019. Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this proposal, which greatly improves on the previous one by: - ensuring that residents have allocated parking areas. - discouraging working-week parking by non-residents (I now understand that no parking will be permitted between 08.00 and 17.00, where there are red lines on the plan). Following our telecom, today, you suggested that I might document any observations/concerns which I may wish to make: - At present, parking is permitted right up to the junction with Ledbury Road, so that drivers turning off Ledbury Road into Lichfield Avenue, especially from the Rose & Crown direction, can be held up dangerously close to the corner by traffic travelling towards Ledbury Road at the same time. - Non-residential parking would still be permitted, uninterrupted, between 17.00 Friday and 08.00 Monday. This has been known to happen. - My own property is right on the edge of the zone where nonresidential parking is to be permitted overnight/at weekends. Though I now understand the concept of the "chicane" along the longer stretch of the Avenue, I'm still not sure I follow why one is needed. My property has only a one-car-wide drive, which is just long enough for two cars. Thus, I would be delighted to be able to purchase a permit, especially for our visitors to park outside our own property, if that were feasible.

Thank you for taking time to talk to me today, to read these notes, and for your consideration.
Having spoken to the council it appears that they would adhere to schemes proposal of two specific vehicle and one visitor permit.  Under this scheme I would have to purchase an additional permit for the second (carer) visitor in the morning who attends to my wife who has MS.  Under these circumstances I am very much against the proposals. If you were to walk along Lichfield Avenue you will see that nearly all houses have off road parking for two and sometimes three vehicles. The original proposal of a single yellow line with double yellow at each end would have kept the road clear for buses and emergency services. My view is that some residents did not want the yellow line outside their property which why we have arrived at the current proposal A sledgehammer to crack a nut.
Regards
the Double Yellow Line restriction should be 10metres and ONLY 10metres from the junction not as shown on the plan. Any vehicle will be able to park on the planned unrestricted area of the 90degree bend which could cause still cause problems for the bus. Should that area be included in residents parking only? We are in favour of the revised parking zone proposals for Lichfield Avenue.
