Having walked the route of the permissive path we at Herefordshire Ramblers are happy to accept this permissive route with some reservations and resolutions.

- L. At the northern end of the path, the gateway should be cleared of vegetation and correctly signed off the road.
- 2. Where the path comes south alongside the road there were signs of equipment over the path. A raised kerb would show line of the path and prevent encroachment.
- 3. The enclosed path around three sides of transport yard must be cleared of undergrowth and kept clear.
- 4. Where the path crosses the roadway it should be clearly signed for pedestrians and drivers to warn of possible danger.
