•	On the 8 th April 2020 Trading Standards Officers from Herefordshire Council attended Europe, 24 Eign Gate Hereford, HR4 0AB and seized a quantity of illegal foreign cigarettes being sold from the premises.	
	The sale of illegal tobacco is a serious problem and undermines the licensing objectives that specifically relate to the prevention of crime and disorder.

On the 6th February 2020 Trading Standards received intelligence from a member of the public that her 15 year old son had purchased two packets of illegal Marlboro foreign labelled cigarettes from Europe, 24 Eign Gate, Hereford, HR4 0AB. One of the packets was given to Trading Standards which were confirmed as illegal. The worker who sold the cigarettes was described as blonde, tall, slim and approximately aged 35-40 with an Eastern European accent.

On 8th April 2020 Trading Standards attended Europe, 24 Eign Gate, Hereford, HR4 0AB to conduct a routine inspection of medicines on sale in the shop as a response to COVID-19. During the inspection, officers found 3 packets of illegal Marlboro cigarettes (consistent with the intel received on the 6th February) and 8 packets of illegal NZ cigarettes placed underneath the till behind the counter. Initially Ina TURULIENE (the manager and designated premises supervisor) told officers that the cigarettes were for personal use.

Further inspection of the counter area revealed a number of large shopping bags full of illegal cigarettes being stored in a cupboard next to the till area – there were 220 packets found in the bags, which were all illegal foreign labelled, the majority of which are known as illicit whites. When confronted, Ina TURULIENE admitted the cigarettes were being sold from the premises at £35 a sleeve.

The black market street value of the cigarettes is approximately £808.50. The duty evasion figure is however much higher at approximately £1848 – This shows the loss of revenue to the chancellor to use on vital public services.

The sale of illegal cigarettes is viewed as a serious offence under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. The guidance states that where certain criminal activity, such as the sale of illegal tobacco occurs in connection with licensed premises, it should be treated particularly seriously

Therefore, the view of Herefordshire Council Trading Standards is that the premises licence for Europe should be revoked.

On Monday 26th September 2016, a member of Trading Standards made representations against the Grant of a Premises Licence for the premises which would be withdrawn should the applicant agree set conditions

The conditions asked for were as follows:

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any equivalent training course within 1 month of commencing employment at the premises. Where there are existing staff this training shall be completed within 3 months of the date that this condition first appears on the licence. Refresher training will be conducted at 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be kept on the premises and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.

A written or electronic register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable to provide required identification to prove their age. Such records shall be kept for a period of 12 months. It will be collected and reviewed on a daily basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.

The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 Policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand of the Police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council. Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any sale area advertising the scheme operated.

On the same day the applicant Ina Turuliene on behalf of IRI LTD agreed to the conditions being put on the premises licence
