| Decision made: | To prosecute company, director and salesman for multiple offences under Consumer Protection From Unfair Trading Regulations 2008- breach of regulations 5, 7, 9, 10, 11 and 15 |
| Reasons for decision: | This is a serious rogue trader case that involves one elderly vulnerable consumer. She was deceived into having roofing work done by the company, with full knowledge of the salesmen and the director. The consumer was sold a contract for over £5,500 and both involved totally unnecessary work at a grossly inflated price. The scam is a very common one nationwide. There is sufficient, reliable, admissible evidence for a realistic prospect of conviction. Prosecution is in the public interest due to: (i)If legal proceedings are not instigated, then it is likely that they will repeat offend; (ii)The defendants acted fraudulently, willfully or negligently; (iii)A prosecution would have a significant impact on maintaining community confidence and should act as a deterrent to others who may be contemplating similar actions. (iv). there is evidence that the offence was premeditated; (v). there are grounds to believe that the defendant was motivated solely by personal gain; There are no public interest factors against prosecution. Covid-19 guidance has been considered and not alternative action is appropriate. The Council has a zero tolerance policy regarding rogue traders There are no fixed penalty notices available A caution is not appropriate due to the seriousness of the incident. |
