| Reasons for decision: | Central government announced the test and trace support payments scheme on 20 September 2020 and an extension to the scheme was announced on 11 January 2021. |
| | Central government is providing further funding for Test and Trace Support Payments of a £500 lump sum payment for employed people on low incomes who are unable to work while they are self-isolating because they cannot work from home. |
| | To be eligible for the Test and Trace Support Payment, an individual must: • have been asked to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace either because they've tested positive for coronavirus or have recently been in close contact with someone who has tested positive; • be employed or self-employed; |
| | be unable to work from home and will lose income as a result; and be currently receiving Universal Credit, Working Tax Credit, income-based Employment and Support Allowance, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Income Support, Housing Benefit and/or Pension Credit. |
| | To be eligible for a discretionary Test and Trace Support Payment, an individual must: |
| | have been asked to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace either because they've tested positive for coronavirus or have recently been in close contact with someone who has tested positive; |
| | be employed or self-employed and earn up to £400 a week; be unable to work from home and will lose at least 50% of earned income as a result; and have less than £3,000 in savings. |
