Consultation:	The head and nursery school leadership team have all been involved in, and consulted upon, the plans.	
Decision made:	To fund up to £244,400 for an extension to create dedicated Nursery provision at St Joseph's RC Primary School, Ross-on-Wye.	
	Funding to be provided from early years Section 106 receipts from various housing developments, 2 year Old capital funding, with the remaining funding covered by the school (including diocesan and charity contributions).	
Reasons for decision:	The nursery at St Joseph's has seen a 325% increase in service hours and 300% growth since 2011. It has been occupying the hall during the day resulting in a lack of indoor PE space for the school.	
	The new provision will provide 2-4 year old places with eligibility for funded places for 2 and 3 year olds which would be beneficial for families moving into the new housing developments in the area.	
	The Ryefield Centre and Chase Hotel, which offered much needed community spaces in the area, have also closed recently. The plan for the school, after completing the nursery and freeing up the hall space, is to open the hall to individuals and groups, during non-term time, creating a 'hall for all' and providing an additional community space.	
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:	S106 contributions have been secured towards Ross early years. A 2 Year Old Capital grant allocation from the government was provided to the council to create additional nursery places. The S106 contribution and the remaining 2 Year Old capital grant allocation along with the schools own funding will be made available to deliver the necessary works required to create the extension.
