	There is a risk that once on site, further investigation work is identified once the asbestos removal works commence that was not previously apparent. Should this contingency be insufficient then a further officer decision will be required.
Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	To decide not to progress to deliver these works at this time. This is not recommended as the risk of these asbestos removal works not being completed means that future building improvements cannot progress.
