Decision title:	Decision to spend from the Property Services Estates Capital Works Programme on the provision of point for point lighting and controls installation to various properties.

Decision made:	That authorisation be given to implement the above recommendation in respect of the key decision dated 31 st January 2020 and spend within the approved budget for the EPC's (Investment Portfolio), Estate Capital Programme 2019/22 CAP909, of not more than £35k (inclusive of professional fees, contingencies, etc) to design and install new "point for point" light fitting replacement with LED equivalent fittings on general lighting and emergency lighting and also introduce lighting controls for energy savings within various industrial units.
Reasons for decision:	<p>C F Roberts Electrical and Mechanical Services have been identified as the bidder representing best value for money following a competitive tender via the SouthWest Portal and assessment process in accordance with Council procurement procedures. Tenders were invited from four contractors and two valid tenders were received for consideration. The work is to be awarded to C F Roberts Electrical and Mechanical Services with a tender value of £20,710.00.</p> <p>The works will offer a cost saving in energy usage, reduce carbon omissions and reduce maintenance requirements. There is also a boost to the local economy as C F Roberts are a local contractor.</p>
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:	None.
Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	<p>Do nothing –</p> <p>This was rejected because the Council will not benefit from the financial and carbon savings this project offers. This will adversely affect the Council's ability to deliver energy savings and carbon reduction targets.</p> <p>It is anticipated that the government will increase the EPC rating required on tenanted building in the near future and this work will increase the current rating.</p>
