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| Reasons for decision:  | The distribution boards need replacing at a number of schools and these works were added to the current Schools Capital Maintenance Programme.  |
|  | To complete the works required at a number of schools to make the building fit for purpose and to address the school's Capital Maintenance request.   |
|  | To ensure all Council buildings are fit for purpose and maintained to the standards as set out in the condition survey to address suitability, sustainability and affordability.  |
| Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/ equality considerations: | There is a risk that once on site, further work is identified once the Distribution Board works commence that was not previously apparent. A contingency has been allowed to cover unforeseen elements once the roofing works commence. Should this contingency be insufficient then a further officer decision will be required.   |
|  | If the Distribution Boards works are not carried out there is risk that the school will experience further issues and the health and safety risk remains.   |
| Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:            | To decide not to progress to deliver these works at this time. This is not recommended as the risk of these works not being completed means that the health and safety risk associated with the continued existence of the buildings remains.   |
