Decision made:	To approve up to £35k of the Household Support Fund grant to deliver
	the high energy medical equipment scheme. Households can receive up
	to £250 via a one off payment. In extreme circumstances a further
	payment will be considered after six weeks of the first payment being
	issued.
Reasons for decision:	Herefordshire Council has received an allocation of £1,329,601.78 from the
	Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) under the Household Support
	Fund.
	In line with DWP guidance most of the funding should be earmarked to
	support those most in need and affected by the recent cost of living crisis.
	The decision to support vulnerable people with medical conditions that are
	facing fuel poverty would meet the recommended guidance.
	Individuals with medical equipment that typically consumes high amounts
	of energy are at greater risk of experiencing fuel poverty due to increased
	bills during the winter months.
	Individuals can make a self-referral or be referred by a professional body in
	order to be considered for the one-off £250 payment. Payment will be
	made within a 14 day from the referral being received. This scheme has the
	potential to benefit up to 140 households. Further information on the
	scheme is provided within the policy (Appendix A).

The scheme specifically targets families on low incomes with children who are eligible for free school meals. It will also aim to target disabled households, especially those that have high utility bills. The Household Support Fund will provide additional support to other financially disadvantaged households in Herefordshire, many of these households will include those who share a protected characteristic e.g. age, so by utilising
	the scheme this will support the council in discharging its Equality duty by supporting many of these households to access these funds through third party agencies.
	All agencies involved in the distribution of the funding will be made aware of their equality responsibilities in regards to the Equality Act.
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal:	The cost of the scheme will be funded through the Household Support Fund allocation of £1,329,601.78.
	The council recognises that the pandemic has exacerbated the inequalities in our society, and this is being further compounded by the increased cost of living. By providing support for those with high energy cost due to the use of medical equipment will help to elevate pressure from the rising cost of energy over recent years.

considered and rejected:	recommended. The Household Support Fund is expected to support households most in need. By providing funding to this demographic will
