	Herefordshire, and Worcestershire. Each authority is required to use this	
	funding to test and refine SEND and AP reforms, in the form of pilot	
	projects in their respective local areas.

Early Language Support for Every Child (ELSEC) - a UK government initiative to improve early identification and support for Reception age children with speech, language, and communication needs who present with mild to moderate speech and language delay. Additionally, this project will support children (age 4-5) with a diagnosis of Autism along with their families and other professionals in promoting early intervention strategies that encourage communication skills.

Progress reports will be discussed with teaching staff AND submitted to the Council's SEND Partnership Group on a termly basis to monitor the project and evaluate the outcomes achieved from using the Project Grant.
