

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Corporate Parenting Action Plan: Education


- Monitoring by Virtual School
- Creation of Personal Education Plans (PEP's)
- Provision of laptops
- Support schools to prevent exclusion
- Development of supported internships for young people with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- Supporting to access higher education, including degree apprenticeships
- Strengthen careers and education advice and guidance

Corporate Parenting Action Plan: Impact

- Two new STEPS Mentors (Support to Engage, Participate and Succeed) bringing the total of STEPS Mentors to 4 A STEPS Team Leader to be appointed in the spring term
- Attendance is stable for autumn term compared with summer term (+0.1% increase to 91.9%)
- Quality assurance shows 87.5% of PEP's signed off by the Virtual School are considered to be of good or very good quality
- Key Stage 1: 50% are achieving expected progress in maths, 33.3% in reading and 41.7% in writing (compared with 43%, 45% and 34% for national KS1 children looked after)
- Key Stage 2: 71.4% are achieving expected or above progress in maths, 61.9% in reading and 61.9% for writing (compared with 71%, 69% and 75% for national KS2 children looked after)
- Key Stage 4: 33.3% of Year 11's are achieving in line with expectations or above in maths and 50% for English Language (compared with 22.1 and 22.1% for national KS4 children looked after)
- Successful DWP application to establish a Herefordshire Youth Employment Hub

You want more back and forth conversations with senior leadership.	 Young people attended the improvement board, and agreed to quarterly meetings to track progress. Stakeholders such as the police have arranged to meet with young people. Engagement with the Director of Children and Young People's Services and the DfE Advisor
You want to be more involved in decision making.	 Care Experienced Council is now in place 8 young people and recruiting Planning in place for "Young Person Council Takeover". Young people regularly involved in interview panels. Focus groups to provide feedback on council projects.
You want a better service for our young people seeking asylum.	 A monthly UASC group is in place which the young people named "United Friends". The first session had 13 young people attend from 6 cities. Travel/accommodation funded for out of county young people to attend events. Designated "UASC PAs" who attend events and build relationships. Specific UASC legal advice Dedicated UASC Social Workers (x2) Age Assessment Training for staff
