Flames (Marmaris), 21 Union Street, Hereford.

I refer to the above premises which are a licensed late night refreshment establishment. The licensed operating hours for the premises end at either 0100hrs or 0130hrs depending on the day of the week.

Your premises were visited by police officers at 0154hrs on Saturday 28 April 2012 and again at 0204hrs on Sunday 29 April 2012. On both these visits the premises were open and were serving hot food to customers.

This is a clear breach of your premises licence. This information has been shared with Herefordshire Council Licensing Authority and if required West Mercia Police will provide the necessary evidence for them to undertake a criminal prosecution.

Further checks will be made at the premises to ensure that you comply with the conditions of the premises licence. In the event of further breaches action appropriate at the time will be taken by the police.

From a policing prospective, please take this letter as a formal warning to you as the named holder of the premises licence for this location.

LICENSING ACT 2003 OPERATING OUTSIDE PREMISES LICENCE AUTHORISED HOURS FLAMES – NOW KNOWN AS MARMARIS KEBAB

Information has been received from West Mercia Police that late night refreshment is being provided beyond the hours authorised on the premises licence.

Once the consultation period has expired, you will be notified in writing by the licensing section of whether any relevant representations have been received, together with details of those representations and a Hearing Date. The letter will explain the options available to you, which include possible negotiations between all parties. Should your application give rise to no relevant representations then your licence shall be granted.

LICENSING ACT 2003 - UNAUTHORISED LICENSABLE ACTIVITY

MARMARIS, 21A UNION STREET, HEREFORD, HR1 2BT

On Saturday 20th April 2013, Fred Spriggs (Licensing Officer) visited your premises at 11.20 pm after you were seen to provide a portion of chips to 2 members of the public.

As you are aware the premises is not licensed and therefore no hot food or drink can be provided from the premises between the hours of 11 pm to 5 am on any day. Whilst you have applied for a licence you are aware are that no licence has been granted and that this matter is due to appear before the Licensing Committee on Thursday. Furthermore this is the fourth occasion that this authority has had to warn you in respect of breaches of the legislation. This supports the opinion of the authority that you are unlikely to promote the licensing objectives particularly that of preventing crime and disorder.

To make the situation absolutely clear to you:

You can not provide hot food or drink between 11 pm to 5 am without a licence.

It is an offence under Section 136 of the Licensing Act 2003 for a premises to be used for any licensable activity without a licence. Any person found guilty of an offence under this section is liable on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to a fine of up to £20,000, or to both.

In line with this Authority's Policy, I must advise you that should you choose to operate again without a premises licence we will take enforcement action against you. Furthermore, the Licensing Authority will being bring this breach to the attention of the committee on Thursday.
