Purpose	To consider and approve the recommendation to consult on introducing On Street parking charges in areas on the periphery of the Historic City Core Centre.			
Decision	<ul> <li>a) residents and businesses are informally consulted on the proposals to introduce on street parking charges at the locations shown in Appendix A for the reasons set out in this report, and;</li> <li>b) the current on street paid parking scheme in Hereford City Centre is extended so that charges for parking apply on Sundays; and</li> <li>c) all operational decisions are delegated to the Interim Service Director, Highways and Transport, to progress these proposals including the formal consultation stage, noting a further Cabinet Member decision will be required to formally implement any changes.</li> </ul>
