Options considered	The council could decide not to proceed with this framework agreement and continue with current arrangements which involves			

	securing 3 quotes from chambers and solicitor agents for specific pieces of work or hearings. This is not recommended as the sums of money being paid to certain suppliers can be substantial over a year. A more robust procurement process is required to ensure the council has undertaken proper due diligence checks on its regular legal suppliers.
