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
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LICENCING HEARING FLOW CHART

4. **Purpose**

To consider an application for an Expedited/Summary licence review of the premises licence in respect of Lyde Court, Lyde Cross, Hereford, HR1 3AE.

5. Recommendation(s)

THAT Sub-Committee determine the interim steps necessary to prevent serious crime or serious disorder at the premises and to promote the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community. They should give appropriate weight to:

- The steps that are necessary to assist with the prevention of serious crime and disorder.
- The representations (including supporting information) presented by all parties,
- The Guidance issued to local authorities under Section 53A of the Licensing Act 2003 by the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006, and
- The Herefordshire Council Licensing Policy.

6. **Key Points Summary**

- Application received for an expedited review on 4 June 2013.
- Hearing arranged for 5 June 2013 within the required 48 hours.
- 4 June 2013 Copies of application and certificate sent to the premises licence holder by email
- Premises Licence Holder advised of review and hearing over phone.

7. Options

7.1 The interim steps that the licensing authority can consider taking are:

Take no action or

Take any of the following steps: -

- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
- (b) the exclusion of the sale of alcohol by retail (or other licensable activities) from the scope of the licence;
- (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
- (d) to suspend the licence;

Where the authority takes a step mentioned in subsection (a) or (b), it may provide that the modification or exclusion is to have effect until the full review hearing.

8. Reasons for Recommendations

8.1 Ensure compliance with the legislation.

9. Introduction and Background

Background Information

- 9.1 The powers to call for an expedited review are contained in Section 53A of the 2003 Act by virtue of the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006. The powers allow:
 - The police to trigger a fast track process to review a premises licence where the police consider that the premises are associated with serious crime or serious disorder (or both); and
 - ii. The licensing authority to respond by taking interim steps quickly, where appropriate, pending a full review.

9.3 The Grounds for the Review

The grounds for the review are contained in Appendix 1 and 2 of the background papers.

9.4 Responsible Authorities

Copies of the application and certificate have been sent to the responsible authorities.

10. Key Considerations

10.1 To consider what action should be taken, if any, to prevent further outbreaks of serious crime and disorder and to promote the four licensing objectives in accordance with the recommendation.

Guidance issued by the DCMS in respect of Expedited Reviews states at paragraph: -

3.5 If the licensing authority decides to take steps at the interim stage then:

The decision takes effect immediately, or as soon after then as the licensing authority directs; but

The licensing authority must give immediate notice of its decision and its reasons for doing so to the holder of the premises licence and the chief officer of police who make the application.

- 3.6 The licensing authority in deciding when its decision on interim steps should take effect should consider the practical implication of compliance in relation to the premises.
- 3.7 In addition, very careful consideration needs to be given to interim steps which would require significant cost or permanent or semi-permanent adjustments to a premises which would be difficult to remove if the outcome of the subsequent full review was to withdraw or modify those steps. The focus for interim steps should be on the immediate measures that are necessary to prevent serious crime or serious disorder occurring. In some circumstances, it might be better to seek suspension of the licence pending the full review, rather than imposing a range of costly conditions or permanent adjustments.

11. Community Impact

11.1 The granting of the licence as applied for may have an impact on the Community.

12. Equality and Human Rights

- 12.1 "A public authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to
 - eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct ... prohibited by or under this Act;
 - advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it;
 - foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it."

13. Financial Implications

13.1 There are unlikely to be any financial implications at this time to the authority.

14. Legal Implications

14.1 The premise licence holder may make representations against the interim steps taken by the licensing authority. There is not a time limit for the premises licence holder to make representation on the interim steps, although this would be within the normal review period of 28 days. On receipt of representations and if they are not withdrawn, a hearing must be arranged within 48 hours of receipt.

This premises is in a rural location, and has been licensed since April 2013. The venue is licensed to sell alcohol up to 0200 at weekends

At about 3.41am on Sunday 02 June 2013, 4 calls were received from people at the premises with regards to serious disorder occuring at the venue Two of the calls indicated in the region of 30 persons fighting and that bottles and glasses were being thrown.

One of the calls made by a family member of the premises licence holder. Officers in numbers attended the venue. They found in the region of 75 people at the location, some were seen with facial injuries and had the appearance of being involved in sort of disorder, a large number were very angry and many appeared drunk. The stance of the police is that large numbers were involved in the disorder and violence for a common purpose

From the calls received and what was found on police attendance, it was obvious that serious disorder had taken place. It was also apparent that the premises was still allowing alcohol to be sold and consumed on the premises in excess of one and half hours after the approved terminal operating hour.

It is the view of West Mercia Police that the premises licence holder had lost control of the event through the numbers involved in the disorder coupled with excessive alcohol consumption. Officers made requests to the premises licence holder to end the event and clear the premises. It is the view of the officers at the time, that she was reluctant to do this. She further stated that 'what could she do' if they did not comply.

This resulted in officers clearing the premises to ensure that no further disorder occurred at the venue.

Notes for guidance:

1. A certificate of the kind mentioned in the form must accompany the application in order for it to be valid under the terms of the Licensing Act 2003. The certificate must explicitly state the senior officer's opinion that the premises in question are associated with serious crime, serious disorder or both.

Serious crime is defined by reference to section 81 of the Regulation of Investigatory

Powers Act 2000. In summary, it means:

- conduct that amounts to one or more criminal offences for which a person who has attained the age of eighteen and has no previous convictions could reasonably be expected to be sentenced to imprisonment for a term of three years or more; or

- conduct that amounts to one or more criminal offences and involves the use of violence, results in substantial financial gain or is conduct by a large number of persons in pursuit of a common purpose.

Serious disorder is not defined in legislation, and so bears its ordinary English meaning.

I am giving this certificate because I am of the opinion that other procedures under the Licensing Act are inappropriate in this case, because⁴:

The level of serious disorder reported and the use of bottles and glasses as weapons.

At about 03.41am on Sunday 02 June 2013, numerous calls were received by West Mercia Police that disorder was occuring at Lyde Court. Some of the calls indicated up to 30 persons fighting and that bottles and glasses were being thrown.

A total of 13 police officers attended the venue to deal with the reports received

It is the view of West Mercia Police that this licensed premises is associated with serious disorder due to the numbers involved, the volume of calls received, the nature of the information given to the police and their observations of what was presented to them on attending the incidents.

It is also the view of the police that the premises licence holder - who is also the designated premises supervisor had lost control of the venue and that she had failed to comply with the operating schedule for the venue with regards to the promotion of the licensing objectives.

West Mercia Police have considered other options available to them with regards to modifying the premises licence either through the standard review process or through negotiation with the premises licence holder. These options are deemed not appropriate as the current premises licence was issued in April 2013. Prior to the issuing of the premises licence, the venue was unlicensed and operated through temporary event notices. The majority of these notices were for classical music events. It appears since the issuing of the full premises licence, the venue is branching out in the type of events they run.

It is the view of West Mercia Police that the designated premises supervisor who is also the holder of the premises licence does not have the skills and experience to manage the venue effectively with regards to promoting the licensing objectives.

There is no requirement for the venue to notify the police with regards to what type of events are being run at the location. West Mercia Police do not feel this is necessary.

However they do feel that additional interim steps are required to promote the licensing objectives.

It is the view of West Mercia Police that the interim steps should be -The removal of the designated premises supervisor from her position of authority.

A terminal hour as per the current premises licence - but to remove the provision allowing the supply of alcohol to residents

The employment of SIA registered door supervisors on a risk assessed basis.

The provision of shatterproof bottles/drinking vessels.

When making these submissions, West Mercia Police are mindful that they are interim steps and may require further consideration/consultation prior to any full review hearing.
