- Have a reasonable number of copies of agenda and reports (relating to items to be considered in public) made available to the public attending meetings of the Council, Cabinet, Committees and Sub-Committees.
- Have access to a list specifying those powers on which the Council have delegated decision making to their officers identifying the officers concerned by title.
- Copy any of the documents mentioned above to which you have a right of access, subject to a reasonable charge (20p per sheet subject to a maximum of £5.00 per agenda plus a nominal fee of £1.50 for postage).
- Access to this summary of your rights as members of the public to attend meetings of the Council, Cabinet, Committees and Sub-Committees and to inspect and copy documents.

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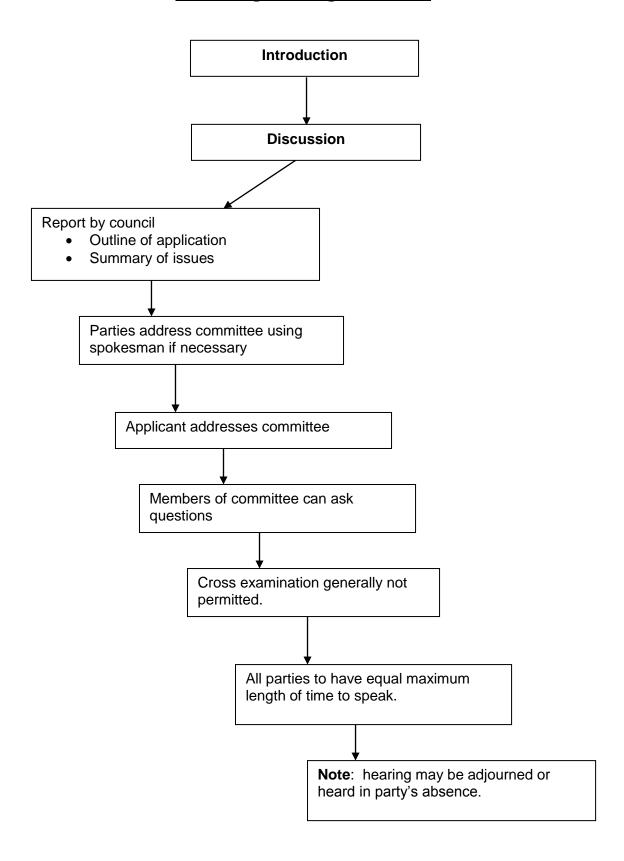
Please also note that other attendees are permitted to film, photograph and record our public meetings provided that it does not disrupt the business of the meeting.

The Seven Principles of Public Life

(Nolan Principles)

1. Selflessness

Holders of public office should act solely in terms of the public interest.

2. Integrity

Holders of public office must avoid placing themselves under any obligation to people or organisations that might try inappropriately to influence them in their work. They should not act or take decisions in order to gain financial or other material benefits for themselves, their family, or their friends. They must declare and resolve any interests and relationships.

3. Objectivity

Holders of public office must act and take decisions impartially, fairly and on merit, using the best evidence and without discrimination or bias.

4. Accountability

Holders of public office are accountable to the public for their decisions and actions and must submit themselves to the scrutiny necessary to ensure this.

5. Openness

Holders of public office should act and take decisions in an open and transparent manner. Information should not be withheld from the public unless there are clear and lawful reasons for so doing.

6. Honesty

Holders of public office should be truthful.

7. Leadership

Holders of public office should exhibit these principles in their own behaviour. They should actively promote and robustly support the principles and be willing to challenge poor behaviour wherever it occurs.

Purpose

To consider an application for a variation for a premises licence in respect of Shooters Bar, Grafton House, Burgess Street, Leominster. HR6 8DE under the Licensing Act 2003

Recommendation(s)

That:

The sub committee determine the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community. They should give appropriate weight to:

- a) The steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives,
- b) The representations (including supporting information) presented by all parties,
- c) The guidance issued to local authorities under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and
- d) The Herefordshire Council Statement of Licensing Policy 2020 2025.

Reasons for Recommendations

Ensures compliance with the Licensing Act 2003

Alternative options

- 1. There are a number of options open to the sub-committee:
 - a) Grant the licence subject to conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application and the mandatory conditions set out in the Licensing Act 2003,
 - Grant the licence subject to modified conditions to that of the operating schedule where the sub-committee considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and add mandatory conditions set out in the Licensing Act 2003,
 - c) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates
 - d) To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premise supervisor, or
 - e) To refuse the application

Key considerations

Licence Application

- 2. The application for the variation of a premises licence has received relevant representations and is therefore brought before the sub-committee for determination.
- 3. Herefordshire Council Statement of Licensing Policy 2020 to 2025 states "All representation must be 'relevant', for example they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the application". This followed paragraph 8.57 in the s182 Guidance which uses the same wording
- 4. The details of the application are:

Summary of Application

- 5. The application (appendix 1) requests the variation of a premises licence to allow the following licensable activities, during the hours shown, as follows:
 - Live Music extended until 01:00hrs Thursday to Saturday.
 - Recorded Music extended to 02:00 Thursday & Sunday and 04:30hrs Friday & Saturday.
 - Late Night Refreshment extended to 02:30hrs Sunday to Wednesday, 03:00 on Thursday and 04:45hrs Friday & Saturday.
 - Sale of Alcohol to commence 09:00hrs every day to allow for occasional Darts and Snooker Tournaments.
 - Sale of Alcohol extended to 02:00hrs Sunday to Wednesday, 02:30hrs on Thursday and 04:30hrs Friday & Saturday.
 - Opening Hours of 09:00hrs to 02:30hrs Sunday to Wednesday, 03:00 on Thursday and 05:00hrs on Friday & Saturday
 - All hours on Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, New Year's Eve and Bank Holiday Weekend Sundays as per the usual Friday & Saturday.
 - The facility to screen occasional live sporting events outside standard hours

Under the Live Music Act 2012 (as amended), an alcohol licenced premises can have live and/or recorded music from 08:00 – 23:00 for up to 500 people, without the need for these activities to be on a premises licence.

Summary of Representations

- 6. One (1) representation has been received from one of the responsible authorities Environmental Health and can be found at Appendix 3
- 7. Correspondence between the applicant's agent and the Environmental Health Officer in regards to the representation can be found at Appendix 4.
- 8. Four (4) relevant representations have been received from members of the public that the licensing authority have accepted as being relevant. (Appendix 5).

Premises History

- 9. The premises was first licenced in 2005 and was known as Re-Rack.
- 10. On 30th March 2011 an application to grant a premises licence was received and the premises was re-named as Shooters Bar. The licence was granted on 28th June 2011.

- 11. On 5th November 2018 a transfer application was received to transfer the name of the licence holder to Shooters Bar Ltd. The licence was issued on 29th November 2018.
- 12. On 16th January 2019, an application was received to vary the premises supervisor (DPS) into the name of Jonathan Rudge. The licence was issued on 4th February 2019.
- 13. On 15th May 2019, an application was received to vary the premises licence to increase the licensable activity timings. The application received relevant representations and therefore the matter was decided at licensing sub-committee on 5 July 2019 where the decision was to grant the variation with additional conditions as agreed with Environmental Health.

Community impact

14. Any decision may have an impact on the local community.

Environmental Impact

15. This report is in relation to a premises license under the Licensing Act 2003 and as such there are minimal environmental impacts for the council, as licensing authority.

Equality duty

- 16. Under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010, the 'general duty' on public authorities is set out as follows:
 - A public authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to -
 - a) eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
 - b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it;
 - c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it.
- 17. There are no equality issues in relation to the content of this report.
- 18. This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in section 1 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 19. Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business

premises). This right may be interfered with by the council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol – Article 1 – also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

Resource implications

20. This report is in relation to a premises license under the Licensing Act 2003 and as such there are minimal resource implications for the council, as licensing authority.

Financial implications

21. There are unlikely to be any financial implications for the council, as licensing authority at this time.

Legal implications

- 22. As relevant representations have been received, the sub committee must determine the application under Section 3.5.7 (c) of the Herefordshire Council constitution. The representations must relate to the licensing objectives and the sub committee must determine the likely effect of the grant of the premises licences on the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 23. The licensing authority must have regard to the promotion of the four licensing objectives namely; the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm in exercising its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Further regard should be had to the statutory guidance under Section 182 of the Act and the Council's own statement of licensing policy. The options available to the licensing authority are set out in section 1 of this report.
- 24. The sub committee should be aware of a number of stated cases which have appeared before the Administrative Court and are binding on the Licensing Authority.
- 25. The case of Daniel Thwaites Plc v Wirral Borough Magistrates' Court (Case No: CO/5533/2006) at the High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division Administrative Court on 6 May 2008, [2008] EWHC 838 (Admin), 2008 WL 1968943, Before the Honourable Mrs Justice Black. In this case it was summed up that: -
- 26. A licensing authority must have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. Licensing authorities may depart from it if they have reason to do so but will need to give full reasons for their actions.
- 27. Furthermore the Thwaites case established that only conditions should be attached to a licence with a view to promoting the Licensing objectives and that 'real evidence' must be presented to support the reason for imposing these conditions.
- 28. This judgement is further supported in the case of The Queen on the Application of Bristol Council v Bristol Magistrates' Court, CO/6920/2008 High Court of Justice Queen's Bench

Division The Administrative Court, 24 February 2009, [2009] EWHC 625 (Admin) 2009 WL 648859 in which it was said:

'Licensing authorities should only impose conditions which are necessary and proportionate for the promotion for licensing objectives'.

29. In addition to this it was stated that any condition attached to the licence should be an enforceable condition.

Right of Appeal

- 30. Schedule 5 of the Licensing Act 2003 gives a right of appeal which states: Decision to grant premises licence or impose conditions etc.
 - (1) This paragraph applies where a licensing authority grants a premises licence under section 18.
 - (2) The holder of the licence may appeal against any decision—
 - (a) to impose conditions on the licence under subsection (2)(a) or (3)(b) of that section, or
 - (b) to take any step mentioned in subsection (4)(b) or (c) of that section (exclusion of licensable activity or refusal to specify person as premises supervisor).
 - (3) Where a person who made relevant representations in relation to the application desires to contend—
 - (a) that the licence ought not to have been granted, or
 - (b) that, on granting the licence, the licensing authority ought to have imposed different or additional conditions, or to have taken a step mentioned in subsection (4)(b) or (c) of that section, he may appeal against the decision.
 - (4) In sub-paragraph (3) "relevant representations" has the meaning given in section 18(6).
- 31. Appeals should be made to the Magistrates Court and must be made within 21 days beginning with the day on which the appellant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision appealed against

Risk management

32. There is little risk associated with the decision at this time as the legislation allows a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within a period of 21 days of being notified of the decision in writing.

- **1.** (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective:
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

Free Drinking Water

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Age verification

- **3.** (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Small Measures

- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Below Cost Price

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or



(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

Licensing objectives

General

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

CCTV will be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of EVIDENTIAL QUALITY in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition.

Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises, fire exits, outside areas, and all areas where the sale/ supply of alcohol occurs.

Equipment MUST be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings MUST be kept in date order, numbered sequentially and kept for a period of 31 days and handed to Police on demand.

The Premises Licence Holder must ensure at all times the designated premises supervisor (DPS) or appointed member of staff is capable and competent at downloading CCTV footage in recordable media format, an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or the Local Authority on demand.

The Recording equipment and tapes/discs shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the DPS or other responsible named individual. An operational daily log report must be maintained endorsed by signature, indicating the system has been checked and is compliant, in the event of any failings actions taken are to be recorded.

In the event of technical failure of the CCTV equipment the Premises Licence holder/DPS MUST report the failure to the Police on contact number '101' immediately.

The Premises Licence Holder or DPS or a person nominated by them in writing for the purpose will employ SIA doorstaff on a risk assessed basis. The risk assessment shall be in writing and shall be made immediately available on request to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police or an authorised officer of the SIA).

The Premises Licence Holder or DPS or a person nominated by them in writing for the purpose, shall maintain a register of door supervisors which shall be kept on the premises showing the names and addresses of the door supervisors, their badge numbers and shall be signed by the door supervisors as they commence and conclude duty. The register shall be made available on demand for inspection by an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), or the Police or an authorised officer of the SIA.

An incident log must be kept at the premises. Incident log records will be retained for a period of 12 months from the date it occurred. It will made immediately available on request to an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or the Police, which must record the following: (a) all crimes reported to the venue



- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB level 1 or any equivalent training course within 1 month of commencing employment at the premises. Where there are existing staff this training shall be completed within 3 months of the date that this condition first appears on the licence. No person shall be authorised to sell or supply alcohol until this training is completed. Refresher training will be conducted at 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be kept on the premises and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.

A last entry time of 01:00hrs for all customers. (save for 'Late Night Workers' who will provide written information that they have come from a place of work which has concluded after last entry time). There shall be no re-entry to premises allowed after this time.

Signage in not less than 32 font shall be clearly displayed prominently at the point of access to the premises in relation to the Admission Policy, Age Policy, Drug Policy, and Dress Policy.

The DPS and all other staff shall ensure that no open vessels are taken off the premises by customers.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

All windows will be kept shut after 22:00 hours when amplified sound is provided on the premises.

Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance.

The Premises Licence Holder or DPS or the responsible person must immediately comply with any request to adjust noise levels/ frequency spectra made by an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the Police.

'Noise' from the premises must not be 'audible or discernible' within any occupied permanent structure where people normally reside or sleep, when assessed with windows and doors closed. 'In this conditions; 'Noise' -is defined as sound which is created by entertainment consisting of either vocal (recorded or live) or instrumental music (recorded or live) or a combination of both. Audible or discernible' -is defined as 'noise' which is distinct above the general hubbub of activity on the site which can be identified by the human ear as originating from discrete sources from the licensed premises'.

The outside area at the front of the premises shall be clearly defined and separated from any public car park by way of a substantial but demountable barrier, additionally -

- (a) Any furniture used in the outside area shall be substantial and removed from the area when the area is not in use.
- (b) The premises licence holder will ensure that empty glasses, plates etc. are removed from the area within 15 minutes of the end of their use in order to ensure safety and hygiene in the area.
- (c) The outside area shall be covered by the premises CCTV system and meet the same criteria as specified in that condition.
- (d) There shall be no use of the area for licensable activities and consumption of alcohol after 2100hrs on all days of the year.
- (e)The outside area shall be suspended in accordance with any request made by a police officer of the Rank of Inspector or above where, in their opinion, any of the 4 licensing objectives may be threatened should it remain
- (f) No live or recorded music to be played in the outside area of the premises.

Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall be displayed at all exits to the premises requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall be displayed at all exits to any beer garden, patio area, smoking area or similar, requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to be quiet.

Live Music will be permitted until 1am and recorded music until 2am on a Thursday on no more than 12 occasions per year and only one event will be permitted per 4 week period. The Licensing Authority will be notified by email (<u>licesning@herefordshire.gov.uk</u> or any other email address subsequently used by them)14 days prior to each event taking place.

A written noise management plan (NMP) shall be provided within 28 days of the date that this condition first appears on the licence. No event shall take place until such time as the NMP has been agreed by Environmental Health.

Protection of Children.

Young persons under the age of 18 years are not allowed on the premises, unless accompanied and supervised by a person over the age of 18 years. However additionally children under the age of 18 (accompanied) will not be allowed on the premises as follows:



(a) after 2230 hours on all nights.

The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 Policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand of an authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003), an authorised Herefordshire Trading Standards Officer or the police. Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 fonts bold) shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any serving area advertising the scheme operated

A written register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable to provide required identification to prove their age. Such records shall be kept for a period of 12 months and will be collected on a daily basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.

No adult entertainment or services or activities must take place at the premises (Adult Entertainment includes, but is not restricted to, such entertainment or services which would generally include topless bar staff, striptease, lap-table, or pole-dancing, performances involving feigned violence or horrific incidents, feigned or actual sexual acts or fetishism, or entertainment involving strong and offensive language).

Background Information:

We never received a copy of the Premises Licence from HC Licensing following the Hearing in July 2019. We requested one repeatedly, and finally received one on 10th June 2021!

NB There has been a recent recognition that HC Licensing was not functioning completely effectively at around this time and indeed matters were missed that have precipitated events that have needed to be 'undone' since. The been particularly effective and helpful in rectifying such matters, and we commend her efforts to you.

Notwithstanding the above, a copy of the Shooters Noise N	Management Plan (NMP) was sent to
by email at 01:35hrs on 210819 to	Please see the attached
screenshot above.	

NB The relevant condition reads: A written Noise Management Plan (NMP) shall be provided within 28 days of the date that this condition first appears on the licence. No event shall take place until such time as the NMP has been agreed by Environmental Health. Consequently we maintain that we are not in breach of our Premises Licence.

In truth the Noise Management Plan has not changed since the improvements to the insultation were made, as we still manage noise in exactly the same way. The insulation means that it is just easier to manage the noise using the same plan.

Subsequent to that, we have now provided you with an updated version of that original plan in any event.

We note that your reason to raise a Representation are that we have not served a copy of the Noise Management Plan upon your Department.

With absolutely massive respect to you (on a personal and professional basis forged over our many years of partnership-working together)...

- 1. We DID serve a copy of the original plan upon your Department as shown, but whatever happened to it once with the Council we do not know.
- 2. We HAVE served an amended copy of same upon you last week, even though very little has changed in the method with which we manage noise.
- 3. Any Representation under the LA'03 must attach itself to one of the Licensing Objectives in this case the Prevention of Nuisance. Failing to serve a copy of the NMP on your Department (even if established) would be a (minor) breach of one of the Conditions of the Licence, and not a failure per se to promote a Licensing Objective. However, evidence of Noise Nuisance, Public Complaints would be valid evidence for example.

We therefore respectfully request whether you have any evidence to suggest that we have undermined or failed to promote any Licensing Objective, most especially that of Public Nuisance? If so, it would be news to us, as we have been assiduous in maintaining good relationships and an open dialogue with our neighbours, your Department in the person of processing substantially in improvements to the

building in order to mitigate any noise issues and consequently in managing our 'noise' extremely effectively.

In the event that there is no such evidence of noise nuisance upon which to found a Representation, we respectfully invite you to withdraw your Representation, but look forward to your site visit this week as part of our ongoing liaison with your Department. In the event that you do not find yourself able to adjust your position, this week we will have no alternative but to apply for additional Temporary Event Notice(s) as part of our upcoming programme of events whilst we wait for an otherwise superfluous Hearing, thus incurring additional and unnecessary expense.

Thank you for your email, received today. I am responding to you as the consultee in Environmental Health only; in relation to the recent application for a variation of a Premises Licence for Shooters. I read the Licence conditions in relation to the Prevention of Public Nuisance which referred to a Noise Management Plan to be provided **and agreed** with, Environmental Health.

As, in your application for a Variation, you referred to the installation of soundproofing; it therefore seemed sensible to me to go forward with a revised NMP. I therefore requested a

copy of this, presumably, revised NMP. As I did not receive a response from yourselves, to this time-limited request, I therefore made representation.

The NMP provided to me since then, is not suitable and sufficient, in my view. A lot of relevant detail is lacking.

The particular consideration with this premises is that, whilst located in the centre of town, it is surrounded by residential accommodation/dwellings. Complaints to this Service over the years have come from all the streets surrounding the premises.

Going forward, it is therefore incumbent on the proprietor, and indeed in his own interest, to provide a NMP that is suitable and sufficient, with the aim of reducing the receipt of noise complaints from residents to the increasingly resource-challenged Environmental Health Service. & West Mercia Police, and also to local Councillors.

Some comments – these are not exhaustive but give a flavour of what is expected:

- (i) While the installation of soundproofing is mentioned (which is proactive); there are no data on tests undertaken. I would expect that the NMP would have the results of acoustic tests following the installation of the soundproofing? Who undertook these tests? An Invoice for rockwool is not relevant.
- (ii) Who is the responsible person in relation to the NMP? Name them. Provide their contact number in the NMP?
- (iii) What equipment is being used?
- (iv) It is mentioned that the noise has been reduced and that DJs have been asked to keep noise "to a sensible level" but do not mention what this level is? This needs to be made clear to everyone in the NMP. Give the level.
- (v) Who will check these levels and when?
- (vi) Where are the noise limiters located? Settings limits?
- (vii) A plan of the premises, illustrating the location of speakers, would be helpful in the NMP
- (viii) The complaints procedure is not detailed enough. If a complaint is received I would expect an <u>immediate</u> response, not just logging. The noise source may not need to be removed just reduced/adjusted.
- (ix) How will you ensure that customers will not cause noise issues? Give details.

I think you will agree that the last two years have been unprecedented in relation to our daily lives, but we are now entering a phase where entertainment premises are endeavouring to return to business. It must also be remembered that **members of the public have, during this time, become accustomed to a much quieter environment** and we, as a Service are consequently in receipt of many more noise complaints. It is, therefore, in the interest of proprietors to have robust, detailed NMPs in place, agreed with Environmental Health in advance, (i) to plan for, (ii) prevent as much as possible, and (iii) deal rapidly with, any noise issues that might arise.

We will visit tomorrow afternoon as planned and go from, there. While I thank you for your complimentary comments, I think you know me well enough to be aware that I like to know where the devil resides!

Specifically the extension of late night hours, late night sale of alcohol, late night refreshment and the late night playing of live and recorded music.

This venue already has significantly late night hours in the town centre, which has a high density of residential properties in and around Central Car Park where it is located.

In 2021 there were four Grade 1 category blue light police incidents which referenced Shooters Bar, three of which were assaults. Given that we were still under covid restrictions for large parts of last year I consider this to be a high figure. There are regular reports to the Town Council of disorderly behaviour in Central Car Park which reference this venue that have likely resulted in a response less than level 1 blue light.

The extension of hours and live music makes this directly comparable with or later than the night club hours in Hereford. The 5am morning extension will draw more people back into Leominster to start or continue drinking again until early morning.

License Policy Section 13, paragraphs 13.1 & 13.2 – Where are the details in the application form of the steps that they propose to take to ensure the proposed licensed hours do not cause problems.

Without this how will the Licensing Authority will give consideration to how the applicant will achieve the Licensing Objectives and the representations made against such hours?

Public Safety

The extension of late night hours, live and played music will completely change the dynamics of the impact of this venue in a residential part of the town centre.

License Policy Section 20, paragraph 20.1 - Where are the General Risk assessments which should show the measures the applicant considers appropriate to reduce the risk. The risk should be on a range of factors including the nature and style of the venue, the activities being conducted there, the location of the premises....

There is no public transport and few if any taxis in Leominster at 5am in the morning.

Specifically the extension of late night hours, late night sale of alcohol, late night refreshment and the playing of late night live and recorded music.

Noise Management Plan and EHO representation 348774 – The application form makes reference to £10,000 sound proofing but there are still noise issues with this premises and there are still reports of nuisance. Will this plan be shown to the license subcommittee reviewing this application?

The exterior of the premises should also be part of the plan to regulate shouting and loud behaviour in the smoking area and along the car park boundary. The fire doors must remain closed at all times and not opened on hot evenings and other times except for emergency during hours of operation.

License Policy Section 21 paragraph 21.1 - General Public nuisance includes any noise generated as a result of the activities at the premises including the behaviour of customers whilst arriving, leaving or at the premises. This may include noise from customers' cars arriving, car stereo systems, car horns, vocal noise from customers, or those that transport customers to and from the venue, revving engines, litter and the obstruction of public highway. The area where such problems could occur may extend beyond the immediate vicinity of the premises.

License Policy Section 21 paragraph 21.8 - In determining applications for new and varied licences, regard will be had to following factors: the location of premises, the type and construction of the building, the likelihood of nuisance and disturbance to the amenity of nearby residents by reason of noise from within the premises as a result of people entering or leaving the premises or from individuals or groups of customers gathered outside (e.g. in order to smoke).

There is no evidence that these two aims have been met. The assertion that to the applicant's knowledge that there have been no more noise complaints has not been backed up by any facts to support this, given the amount of town council time spent discussing Shooters Bar and central car park with CCTV and the police.

Shop windows are regularly smashed in Leominster. This costs shopkeepers money, makes their businesses look less attractive and makes the town look dreadful. Anything that reduces the numbers of drunk people causing damage would be welcome.

The request for an extension of off sales of alcohol from Shooters is particularly worrying, as people may continue to drink in the car parks and streets.

Public Safety

There was a recent assault in Central carpark.

Numerous calls to the police have been made over a period with regards to noise and other late night nuisance. There are no street pastors in Leominster. And generally no police late at night either.

To Prevent Public Nuisance

Residents are regularly disturbed by inebriated people who leave Shooters Bar in the early hours of the morning, congregate in Central car park and wander round the town centre. Many flats over shops are lived in and many of the windows are old and provide little protection against noise. So a large number of residents are disturbed.

The request to open till 5am on Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Eve and Sundays before bank holidays is unfair to neighbours, qwho surely have some right to sleep in their own homes.

The request to open on Bank holiday Mondays till 5am is also unreasonable. This is a day before a normal workday when neighbours should be able to sleep soundly.

The request for additional opening for live sports events is difficult to understand, as the venue is open from 9am till 11pm every day anyway.

I welcome the news that noise insulation has been improved. However I request that no extension for live or recorded music be granted until the venue produces the results of professional noise testing, so that the licensing committee can evaluate if noise levels from within the venue are a nuisance to neighbours.

Noise outside the venue is also an issue and cannot be soundproofed.
