

The Seven Principles of Public Life

(Nolan Principles)

1. Selflessness

Holders of public office should act solely in terms of the public interest.

2. Integrity

Holders of public office must avoid placing themselves under any obligation to people or organisations that might try inappropriately to influence them in their work. They should not act or take decisions in order to gain financial or other material benefits for themselves, their family, or their friends. They must declare and resolve any interests and relationships.

3. Objectivity

Holders of public office must act and take decisions impartially, fairly and on merit, using the best evidence and without discrimination or bias.

4. Accountability

Holders of public office are accountable to the public for their decisions and actions and must submit themselves to the scrutiny necessary to ensure this.

5. Openness

Holders of public office should act and take decisions in an open and transparent manner. Information should not be withheld from the public unless there are clear and lawful reasons for so doing.

6. Honesty

Holders of public office should be truthful.

7. Leadership

Holders of public office should exhibit these principles in their own behaviour. They should actively promote and robustly support the principles and be willing to challenge poor behaviour wherever it occurs.

To consider an application for a grant of a premises licence in respect of Bebrosa Ltd, 24 Eign Gate, Hereford. HR4 0AB under the Licensing Act 2003.

Recommendation(s)

That:

The sub-committee determine the application with a view to promoting the licensing objectives in the overall interests of the local community. They should give appropriate weight to:

- a) The steps that are appropriate to promote the licensing objectives,
- b) The representations (including supporting information) presented by all parties,
- c) The guidance issued to local authorities under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003, and
- d) The Herefordshire Council Statement of Licensing Policy 2020 2025.

Reasons for Recommendations

Ensures compliance with the Licensing Act 2003

Alternative options

- 1. There are a number of options open to the sub-committee:
 - a) Grant the licence subject to conditions that are consistent with the operating schedule accompanying the application and the mandatory conditions set out in the Licensing Act 2003,
 - b) Grant the licence subject to modified conditions to that of the operating schedule where the sub-committee considers it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and add mandatory conditions set out in the Licensing Act 2003,
 - c) To exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates
 - d) To refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premise supervisor, or
 - e) To refuse the application

Key considerations

Licence Application

- 2. The application for the grant of a premises licence has received relevant representations and is therefore brought before the sub-committee for determination.
- 3. Herefordshire Council Statement of Licensing Policy 2020 to 2025 states "All representation must be 'relevant', for example they must be about the likely effect of the grant of the application". This followed paragraph 8.57 in the s182 Guidance which uses the same wording.

Summary of Application

5. The application (appendix 1) requests the grant of a premises licence to allow the following licensable activities, during the hours shown, as follows:

Sale/Supply of Alcohol (consumption off the premises)

Monday - Sunday 09:00 - 21:00

Summary of Representations

- 6. Two (2) objections have been received from responsible authorities Trading Standards (Appendix 2) and West Mercia Police (Appendix 3).
- 7. One (1) further representation has been received from a responsible authority, Trading Standards (appendix 4) requesting conditions to be put on the licence if granted. These conditions have not been agreed by the applicants and the applicant has failed to engage with Trading Standards over these.

Community impact

8. Any decision may have an impact on the local community.

Environmental Impact

9. This report is in relation to a premises license under the Licensing Act 2003 and as such there are minimal environmental impacts for the council as Licensing Authority.

Equality duty

10. Under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010, the 'general duty' on public authorities is set out as follows:

A public authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to -

- a) eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it;
- c) Foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it.

- 11. There are no equality issues in relation to the content of this report.
- 12. This report has human rights implications for both the premises licence holder and the residents from the local neighbourhood. Any of the steps outlined in section 1 of this report may have financial implications for a licensee's business and livelihood and/or may have impact upon the day to day lives of residents living in close proximity to the premises.
- 13. Article 8(i) of the European Convention of Human Rights provides that everyone has the right to respect for his/her private and family life and his/her home (which includes business premises). This right may be interfered with by the council on a number of grounds including the protection of rights and freedoms of others. The First Protocol Article 1 also provides that every person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions and shall not be deprived of his possessions except in the public interest and conditions provided for by law. Members must accordingly make a decision which is proportionate to the hearing and endeavour to find a balance between the rights of the applicant, residents and the community as a whole.

Resource implications

14. This report is in relation to a premises license under the Licensing Act 2003 and as such there are minimal resource implications for the council as Licensing Authority.

Financial implications

15. There are unlikely to be any financial implications for the council as Licensing Authority at this time.

Legal implications

- 16. As relevant representations have been received, the sub-committee must determine the application under Section 3.5.7 (c) of the Herefordshire Council constitution. The representations must relate to the licensing objectives and the sub-committee must determine the likely effect of the grant of the premises licences on the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 17. The Licensing Authority must have regard to the promotion of the four licensing objectives namely; the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm in exercising its functions under the Licensing Act 2003. Further regard should be had to the statutory guidance under Section 182 of the Act and the Council's own statement of licensing policy. The options available to the Licensing Authority are set out in section 1 of this report.
- 18. The sub-committee should be aware of a number of stated cases which have appeared before the Administrative Court and are binding on the Licensing Authority.
- The case of Daniel Thwaites Plc v Wirral Borough Magistrates' Court (Case No: CO/5533/2006) at the High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division Administrative Court on 6 May 2008, [2008] EWHC 838 (Admin), 2008 WL 1968943, Before the Honourable Mrs Justice Black. In this case it was summed up that: -
- 20. A Licensing Authority must have regard to guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182. Licensing authorities may depart from it if they have reason to do so but will need to give full reasons for their actions.

- 21. Furthermore the Thwaites case established that only conditions should be attached to a licence with a view to promoting the Licensing objectives and that 'real evidence' must be presented to support the reason for imposing these conditions.
- 22. This judgment is further supported in the case of The Queen on the Application of Bristol Council v Bristol Magistrates' Court, CO/6920/2008 High Court of Justice Queen's Bench Division The Administrative Court, 24 February 2009, [2009] EWHC 625 (Admin) 2009 WL 648859 in which it was said:

'Licensing authorities should only impose conditions which are necessary and proportionate for the promotion for licensing objectives'.

23. In addition to this it was stated that any condition attached to the licence should be an enforceable condition.

Right of Appeal

24. Schedule 5 Part 1 of the Licensing Act 2003 gives a right of appeal which states:

Rejection of application relating to premises licences

- 1. Where a licencing authority-
 - (a) Rejects an application for a premises licence under section 18

The applicant may appeal against the decision.

Decision to grant premises licence or impose conditions etc.

- 2. (1) This paragraph applies where a licensing authority grants a premises licence under section 18.
- (2) The holder of the licence may appeal against any decision—
 - (a) to impose conditions on the licence under subsection (2)(a) or (3)(b) of that section, or
 - (b) to take any step mentioned in subsection (4)(b) or (c) of that section (exclusion of licensable activity or refusal to specify person as premises supervisor).
- (3) Where a person who made relevant representations in relation to the application desires to contend—
 - (a) that the licence ought not to have been granted, or
 - (b) that, on granting the licence, the licensing authority ought to have imposed different or additional conditions, or to have taken a step mentioned in subsection (4)(b) or (c) of that section, he may appeal against the decision.
- (4) In sub-paragraph (3) "relevant representations" has the meaning given in section 18(6).
- 25. Appeals should be made to the Magistrates Court and must be made within 21 days beginning with the day on which the appellant was notified by the licensing authority of the decision appealed against

Risk management

26. There is little risk associated with the decision at this time as the legislation allows a right of appeal to the Magistrates Court within a period of 21 days of being notified of the decision in writing.



Trading Standards Objection – 31.01.2023

I am an officer authorised under the Licensing Act 2003.

I refer to the application made to Grant a premises licence in respect of Bebrosa, 24 Eign Gate, Hereford.

I would like to object to the recent premises licence application made by Mantas Bagdonas of Berbrosa Limited (14503570) for 24 Eign Gate, Hereford, HR4 0AB.

On the 18th November 2022, the premises licence was revoked for IRI Ltd t/a Europe, 24 Eign Gate, Hereford, following a review launched by West Mercia Police. Prior to this, in the summer of 2020, the licence for the same premises was suspended for three months following a review launched by Trading Standards - The director of this company was Ina Turuleine during both suspension and revocation.

The company Berbrosa Limited was incorporated by company director Mantas Bagdonas on the 24th November 2022, less than a week after the licence for 24 Eign Gate (the premises the company has now applied for) was revoked. Berbrosa Limited itself is registered to 219 Belmont Road, Hereford.

Mr Bagdonas has previously been director of a company called MISUN LIMITED (12064775) from June 2019 until March 2020. There is also a record on Companies House showing Mr Bagdonas as being director and owner of the same company from 13th March 2020 until 21st August 2020, with the registered address throughout this whole period being 24 Eign Gate, Hereford, HR4 0AB – The same address as Europe and the current premises he is applying for a premises licence under his new company Berbrosa Limited.

Prior to Mr Bagdonas being sole director of MISUN LIMITED, Ina Turuliene (as mentioned above) was director of MISUN LIMITED from 24th June 2019 until 28th October 2019 and another record shows as being appointed and resigning as director on the same day on the 13th March 2020.

Mantas Bagdonas and Ina Turuliene were therefore directors of the same company, at the same time, for a number of months, which was registered to 24 Eign Gate, Hereford HR4 0AB - The same premises where the alcohol licence was revoked back in November 2022.

Whilst, on the face of it, the new company Berbrosa Limited may seem completely separate from IRI Ltd t/a Europe, it is clear from Companies House records that there has been a long-standing business connection between Ina Turuliene and Mantas Bagdonas. This information therefore, in my opinion, calls into question the legitimacy of the new premises licence application by Berbrosa Limited for 24 Eign Gate, Hereford. The history of the premises has come under scrutiny a number of times and committee felt it appropriate to suspend and eventually revoke the licence.

I would suggest there is a strong possibility that the new application is an attempt to circumvent the Licensing sub-committee decision and obtain a new premises licence under false pretences. The application is for a premises which has previously been linked to both the new applicant (Mantas Bagdonas) and previous licence holder (Ina Turuliene).

On behalf of West Mercia Police, I object to the application made by Mantas Bagdonas of Berbrosa Limited (14503570) for 24 Eign Gate, Hereford, HR4 0AB.

The premises has a history of selling illegal tobacco, the handling of stolen goods and selling medication without the correct licence.

Having read the comprehensive report from Paul Di Lucia from Trading Standards, I am satisfied that the connection between the previous licensee and the current applicant is such, that I do not believe that the licensing objectives would be upheld.

Should the licensing sub-committee decide to grant the premises licence, West Mercia Police would seek relevant and enforceable conditions from Herefordshire Council's Licensing Policy 2020 – 2025 Model Pool of Conditions

Regarding the attached application, I would propose the standard conditions as listed below in relation to the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Protection of Children from Harm.

PLEASE NOTE THAT WE WILL BE SUBMITTIG A SEPARATE DOCUMEMT REGARDING OUR CONCERNS AROUND THE APPLICATION IN GENERAL AND THE CONNECTION BETWEEN THE DIRECTOR OF THIS NEW LIMITED COMPANY AND THE PREVIOUS ALCOHOL LICENCE HOLDER AT THE SHOP.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol to be trained in responsible alcohol retailing to the minimum standard of BIIAB Level 1 or any equivalent training course within 1 month of commencing employment at the premises. Where there are existing staff this training shall be completed within 3 months of the date that this condition first appears on the licence. No person shall be authorised to sell or supply alcohol until this training is completed. Refresher training will be conducted at 6 monthly intervals. Training records shall be kept on the premises and produced to the police or an "authorised person" (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.

Protection of Children from Harm

The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 Policy. Such policy shall be written down and kept at the premises. The policy shall be produced on demand of an authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or the police or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council. Prominent, clear and legible signage (in not less than 32 font bold) shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any bar advertising the scheme operated.

A written or electronic register of refusals will be kept including a description of the people who have been unable to provide required Identification to prove their age. Such records shall be kept for a period of 12 months and will be collected on a daily basis by the Designated Premises Supervisor and produced to the police or an 'authorised person' (as defined by Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) or an authorised Trading Standards Officer of Herefordshire Council on demand.

No adult entertainment or services or activities must take place at the premises (Adult Entertainment includes, but is not restricted to, such entertainment or services which would generally include topless bar staff, striptease, lap-table, or pole-dancing, performances involving feigned violence or horrific incidents, feigned or actual sexual acts or fetishism, or entertainment involving strong and offensive language).
