Following an investigation of problems that local residents had at footpath A4 Adforton, our Footpaths Officer, Mike Oliver, requested a site meeting with you. Our Chairman John Miles and the main landowner Parish Councillor Simon Whiteman were also there.


Considering the many problems with stream crossings, bridges and scrub growth, it was agreed that the footpath would be much easier to walk if it were moved to the other side of the stream.

At present, the path joins the very busy and narrow A4110 on the crest of a hill. It is easy to imagine dangers, such as two heavy vehicles meeting at this crest at the same time as a family with children and a dog! All present at this meeting agreed that it would be much safer if the path were rerouted to emerge onto the roadside opposite the lay-by, and with a clear view of the road in both directions.

Safety of road users and walkers is the most important point that has emerged from the site meeting. More local and visiting walkers could then enjoy a circular route.

The Border Group Parish Council supports the application to reroute A4 Adforton.
