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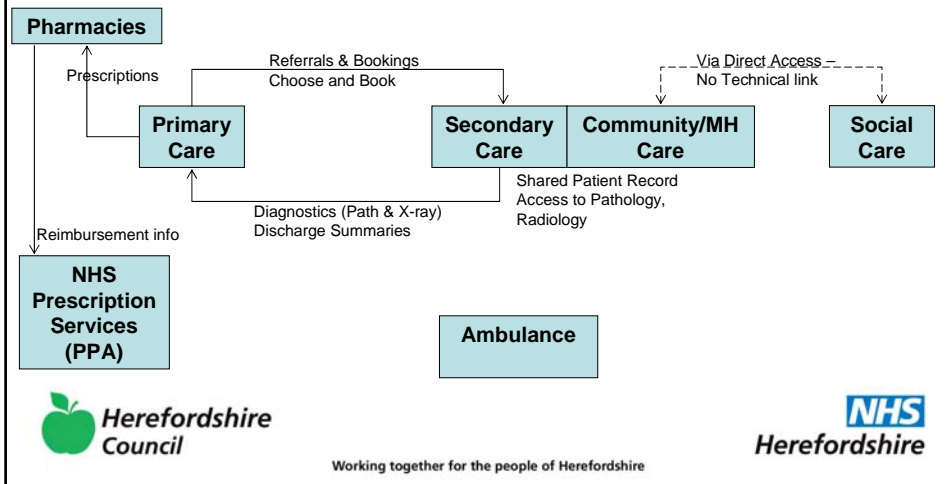
What do we mean by ICT linkages?

- Enabling information to flow between systems in a secure and managed process that facilitates the appropriate sharing of information between staff and organisations.
- The benefits of linking ICT systems is that relevant Information is available to various professionals across different departments and organisations who are involved in the care of patients/service users.
- Information Sharing is facilitated by linking ICT systems, however, appropriate sharing of paper records also takes place where ICT linkages are not possible.
- All information sharing within and between organisations has to be the appropriate governance frameworks, specified by legislation and best practice.

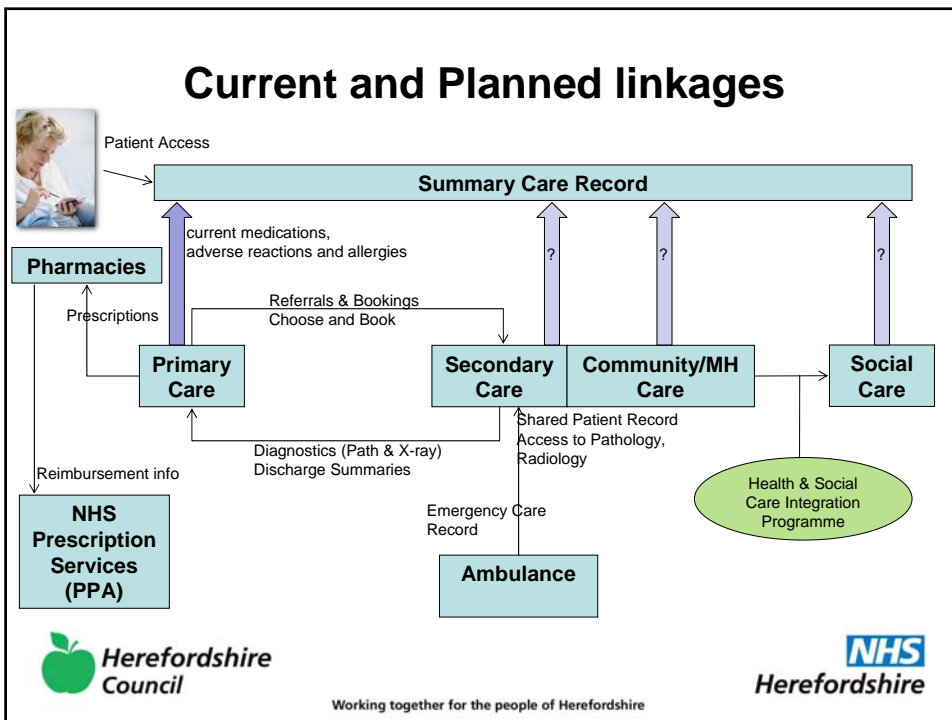

Health & Social Care Integration Programme - 1

- Enabling relevant information to be shared between the NHS Care Records Service and adult electronic social care records systems.
- Approach includes:
 - Upgrading existing social care IT systems
 - Enabling social care systems to obtain NHS number
 - Using 'NHS Data Spine' to share health and social care assessments and care plans between care practitioners.
 - Ensuring appropriate Information Governance including the requirement for any information sharing between the NHS and social care only with the individual's consent
- Work commenced on:
 - Contact assessment
 - Overview assessment
 - Specialist assessment outcome
 - Integrated care/support plan



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Health & Social Care Integration Programme - 2

- Demonstrator sites
 - Phase 1 – 9 sites (Barnsley, Camden, Hampshire, Lincolnshire, Rochdale, Shropshire, Stockport, Warwickshire and Westminster)
 - Aim: **“test and evaluate innovative approaches to effective information sharing between health and social care, and partner organisations”**
- Timescales
 - April 2010 - planned date for health systems to be enabled for exchanging messages with social care systems
 - But..
 - Actual implementation dates not yet confirmed
 - Social Care systems connectivity dates not yet confirmed, Frameworki working with Greenwich to develop and test NHS connectivity – good progress to date.



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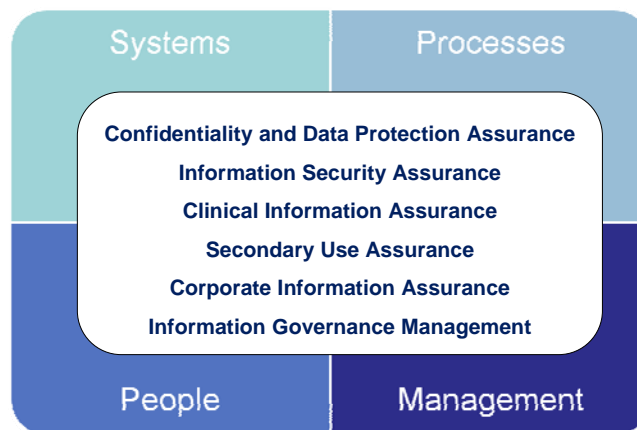
