Members of the Licensing Panel of the Council's Regulatory Committee considered the above application, full details of which appeared before the Members in their agenda and the background papers.

Prior to making their decision the Members heard from PC Mooney, representing West Mercia Police as well as Mr Chadd, the applicant, and Dr Caldwell, one of the interested parties who had made a representation in respect of the application.

Having carefully considered those matters brought before them, the Committee were of the opinion that the application should be **granted subject** to the conditions appearing below. In reaching their decision, the Members had full regard to both the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003 and the Council's Licensing Policy. The Members imposed conditions in order to promote the four licensing objectives, namely the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm.

The application was granted in respect of the hours of operation of the licensable activities described in the box above together with the following conditions

- The mandatory conditions of The Licensing Act 2003.
- All conditions proposed by the applicant under section p of the application form.

**PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER**

- The provision of CCTV which meets the requirements and expectations of the Licensing Authority and Police. CCTV must be in operation at all times the premises are used for licensable activities.
- That a capacity limit is set in accordance with the fire risk assessment.
- The provision of an incident book.
- The prevention of open containers being removed from the premises, except to the outside licensed area.
- The provision of registered door staff on a risk assessed basis by the premise licence holder.
- That the licensed areas be clearly defined by substantial structures, such as trellis fences. (Rear and front outside areas of premises)
- That the licensed areas be covered by the CCTV system. (Rear and front outside areas of premises)
- That the supply of alcohol is predominantly ancillary to the service of a substantial table meal. (Rear and front outside areas of premises)
- That the supply of alcohol and the service of food are by the waitress service only. (Front outside area of premises)
- That a terminal hour of 1800 is imposed for the use of this area for the supply and consumption of alcohol. (Front outside area of premises)
- That a terminal hour of 2200 is imposed for the use of this area for the supply and consumption of alcohol. (Rear outside area of premises)
- That no new patrons be permitted to enter the premises after 2330.

Under Schedule 5 Section 2, the applicant or any party making representation may appeal against the decision. Section 9 states that such an appeal must be made to the Magistrates Court within a period of 21 days from the date that the applicant is notified in writing of the decision.
