To Prevent Public Nuisance Whilst it appears there is a welcoming in the village of the reopening of the Live & Let Live public house, it must be with the consideration of those living in its vicinity.
In the new owner's application for a licence he has incorrectly stated that the premises is located on the outskirts of the village. It fronts and to its side domestic residencies which are only a garden length away and which receive any noise full on. This is the experience of over 30 years of living near to the public house. Depending on the landlord, sometimes the operation was more akin to a bawdy house rather than a country pub.

To request opening till midnight for 365 days a year is unreasonable even if it were for only one day. The village is very quiet and having no background noise, any noise is accentuated. To have a music licence allowing such noise till midnight is totally unreasonable for those living nearby.

Other local pubs seem to think 11:00pm is quite adequate for them. To have such an application
does not provide any confidence in the new owner's desire to run his new business in
consideration of his neighbours, but for only his own purposes. To make a nuisance of himself is
only going to aggravate the local community and deter them from visiting his pub.
