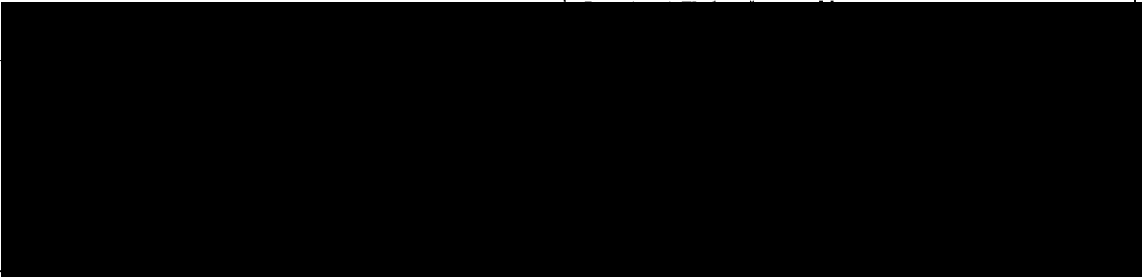

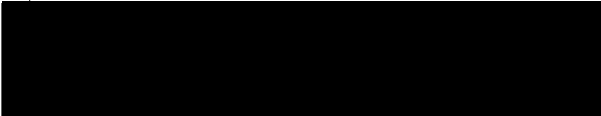

CONTINUATION OF REPRESENTATION FORM – INTERESTED PARTIES

Representation – To Prevent Public Nuisance:

I am a local resident [REDACTED]

After being closed for a number of years, The Queens Head opened again for trading during May 2015. There has already been an initial problem with noise nuisance when the Queens Head first re-opened in May 2015 which gave rise to many complaints from the private residents in the area.

When the Queens Head was previously open and trading, there was an ongoing noise problem with regard to both customers and music. In particular, music was played at high volumes [REDACTED]

show consideration to the surrounding neighbours and the volume (along with the customers own noise levels) to be reduced. Very often, any reduction in volume was only temporary and was soon increased the same evening. The Queens Head was owned by the same person then as is making the licensing application now, namely Mr N R Morris.

In addition to unacceptable noise levels, drunken and foul language was often heard and experienced from certain customers leaving the public house. Whilst I can accept that such occurrences may be likely at a weekend, I cannot accept that this level of disruption should be tolerated by local residents for seven days a week which will adversely affect the wellbeing and day to day lives of fellow residents.

The smoking area of the public house backs onto an area that is next to a residents' property and is not enclosed or segregated in any way. Unacceptably high noise levels can therefore presently be heard in this area immediately surrounding the public house.

It is my opinion that on both present and past experience, the increase in licencing hours to 01.00am for seven days a week will result in a recurrence of the public nuisance and disorder that has previously been experienced and is wholly inappropriate to the area in which the public house is situated.
