Consultation:	The head teacher and governors of the school have been involved
	from the start of the project. The local ward member has been
	consulted and has not objected to the scheme.
Decision made:	Award a contract to SC Joseph for the works required to build a new
	permanent build classroom block, remove the existing double
	mobiles and reinstate the land occupied by the mobiles into play
	space for the school at a total cost of up to £450,000 including
	contingency, statutory and professional fees.
Reasons for decision:	Almeley Primary School is a small council maintained school currently
	rated as good by Ofsted and has been consistently admitting children
	up to its planned admission number.
	The existing mobile accommodation does not meet the requirements
	in terms of space standards as defined by the Department for
	Education's Building Bulletin 103 Area Guidelines For Schools which
	set out nationally agreed standards. The classrooms are small and
	the mobile is in poor condition.
	Over the last few years the school have been regularly appointing
	contractors to lift the mobiles on the one side where it appeared that
	they were sinking into the ground causing a difference in floor levels
	between the units. Further adjustments are complicated by the jacks
	used to adjust the height of the mobiles having reached their
	maximum extent. Additional adjustments therefore require the
	insertion of concrete blocks below the jacks.
	The new building will be located to the side of the main school
	building on a small separate hard play area. It will compromise two
	appropriately sized classrooms with storage and toilets.
	The project includes the removal and disposal of the existing mobiles
	which will not be required once the new block has been completed
	and made ready for occupation.
	The contract will be awarded in accordance with council contract
	procurement rules following a competitive tendering process.
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Highlight any risks/finance/legal/equalit y considerations:

associated The costs for the works will be covered using £450,000 corporate funding that has been made available in the capital programme and is included in the Medium Term Financial Strategy.

> The responsibility for health and safety whilst the works are in progress lies with the contractor. They will conform to the CDM 2015 (Construction Design and Management) Regulations, under which they will produce the necessary method statements and risk assessments for the work undertaken. The site will be kept separated, as far as possible, once work has started, and will be kept secured at all times to prevent unauthorized access.

options considered and rejected:

Details of any alternative Not to award. This option is not recommended as a competitive tendering process has been carried out and seven compliant bid submissions were received from contractors. The works are required to ensure the children at the school can continue to be educated in satisfactory accommodation.

> Award to a different contractor. This option is not recommended as all bids received through the tendering process were evaluated on a cost / quality basis and the successful contractor was considered to offer the best value.
