Consultation:	In accordance with S222 of the Local Government Act 1972 we consider a prosecution is both appropriate and reasonable in this matter for the promotion or protection of the interests of the people of the County of Herefordshire which is also in accordance with the Herefordshire Council's Enforcement and Prosecution Policy.
Decision made:	To prosecute the defendant for offences under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, Section 117
Reasons for decision:	The defendant parked his car in a designated disabled parking bay in Broad Street, Hereford on 6 th November 2018. He displayed his deceased wife's disabled persons parking badge which if used correctly would have allowed up to three hours free parking in what can be considered a prime city centre location. The defendants wife was deceased at the time the badge was being used, so there is no doubt that the blue badge concession was being abused. The defendant informed CEO 40 that he thought he could continue to use his deceased wife's blue badge. In the PACE interview by post the defendant confirmed that he was the person responsible for the offence and stated that he using the badge as he had been asked to go to the Nat West bank in Hereford to resolve a number of issues related to his wife's bank account.
