Consultation:	Cabinet debated and approved a report on the 2019/20 Local Authority Schools Maintenance Programme on 17 January 2019. Consultation has already been done in respect of the overall
	programme with the Capital Strategy Consultative Group, comprising a number of headteachers and council officers, who agreed the programme as a constructive way forward for the use of the grant.
	Political groups were consulted on the programme and no objections or comments were received.
Decision made:	 Agreement to: To approve the window replacement planned maintenance works at Hampton Dene Primary School, to be undertaken via Balfour Beatty Living Places, at an initial cost of £71,206 plus associated contingency, professional and statutory fees. A total cost up to the value of £83,000 Fund the works from the existing school capital maintenance budget
Reasons for decision:	Hampton Dene was included in the approved schools planned maintenance programme 2019/20 for window works. The costs received lie within the original budget provided in the cabinet report of £75k plus fees.

Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:	The works can be covered within the budget originally allocated for windows as part of the planned maintenance programme. There is a risk that once on site, further work is identified if the condition of the window surrounds are found to be poor. A contingency has been allowed to cover unforeseen elements once the existing windows have been removed. Should this contingency be insufficient than a further officer decision will be required.
Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	Do nothing. This is not recommended as the windows are in poor condition and have been highlighted as requiring replacement in the latest condition survey. Not replacing the windows could cause further deterioration to the building fabric leading to greater reactive costs. Replace fewer windows. The number of windows put forward for replacement has already been reduced to fit as close as possible to the allocated budget. A further reduction will only prolong the poor condition of the existing windows.
