A total contract sum has been agreed with the contractor for the value of £4,866,452. The council has already paid Morgan Sindall for works to a value of £730,613 which leaves an outstanding order of £4,135,839 to be authorized.</li> <li>To move the contingency budget to enable the council to award the construction contract to Morgan Sindall.</li> </ol>		
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/ equality considerations:	<ul> <li>a) By not appointing Morgan Sindall, the council is at risk of not completing the expansion of Marlbrook Primary School on time and will prolong the use of mobile classrooms at the school which are no-longer adequate for learning and is not in line with the schools capital strategy which aims to remove all mobile classrooms in schools as part of any capital investment.</li> <li>b) The school is at risk of not having enough space or facilities to</li> </ul>		
	accommodate the intake of pupils in September 2021. The facilities will not be appropriate and further temporary accommodation will be required which will be an additional expense for the council to incur.		
Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	The project could be abandoned in its entirety and/or further temporary classrooms could be provided to accommodate growing pupil numbers instead of a new school building. This is not recommended as current accommodation does not meet the Department for Education's Building Bulletin 103 Area Guidelines for Schools recommendations, and the Schools Capital Investment Strategy aims to remove temporary classrooms.
