Decision made:	To reopen the Bromyard, Kington and Ledbury Household Recycling Centres with a booking system, from week commencing Monday 6 th July 2020 (subject to all requirements being in place) with normal opening hours. This follows the reopening of Hereford and Leominster on Sat 9 May and the Ross on 8 June. Further information on Herefordshire's Household Recycling Centres is available at

Reasons for decision:	The decision has been taken to reopen the Bromyard, Kington and Ledbury Household Recycling Centres, while still continuing to protect the public from the threat of Covid-19.
	 The reopening of these Household Recycling Centres will: Ease the pressure on the council's household waste collection service, providing an additional location for residents to dispose of their household waste; Provide full coverage for residents across the county; Require additional resource to be allocated to our contractor to appoint additional staff required to open these recycling centres; Better fulfill the council's statutory obligation to provide places for residents to disposal of their household waste; This will complement existing additional resource at our three main facilities to protect staff and the public from the threat of Covid-19; Permit social distancing and improved hygiene control measures to be implemented at all sites; Encourage only the deposit of essential and unavoidable household waste; Ensure services and councils resources are not overstretched.
	 Require a booking system to prevent queuing traffic and limit numbers of people on site to conform to social distancing requirements.

options considered and	 Following the successful re-opening and introduction of a booking system at the Ross on Wye recycling centre is it proposed to introduce this system to support the re-opening of the Bromyard, Kington and Ledbury site. The booking system will limit access to each recycling centre to control the number of people on site at any time and limit the spread of Covid-19, protecting both staff and the public; The booking system will also help to mitigate traffic congestion which will be unacceptable to surrounding businesses and residential premises as well as the highway authorities; A booking system will reduce the need for additional staff on the gate controlling access and staff managing traffic, to help reduce costs. Encouraging residents to visit a Household Recycling Centre presents a greater opportunity for transmission of Covid 19. Both Staff and Public will be at increased risk of contracting Covid 19 than if the recycling centre remained closed; Residents vulnerable to Covid 19 may be encouraged to make non-essential journeys to this Household Recycling Centre to dispose of waste, which could be argued to be avoidable; Additional costs of £175k to be shared with our partners Worcestershire County Council are anticipated to allow our contractors to employ at least 9 additional members of staff to manage the facility and implement required social distancing requirements; Herefordshire Council's share of this cost is expected to be circa £40k, which will be met by the waste management team's revenue budget. Not opening these Recycling Centres has been considered. This was not recommended as it is likely to result in additional pressure on the set of the count is consultioned.
