However, it is unlikely that many similar schemes to Cinderford will come through the grant and the other three are more representative of the type of projects that will come through in the future. Despite the disparity in cost vs benefit, each project passed the Value for Money test detailed in the Fastershire Broadband Strategy and was therefore approved.

Equality: Access to broadband is a factor of digital exclusion to information, education, opportunities and social networking. The community scheme is a way of addressing gaps in coverage and therefore supporting equality. Legal: These projects have been procured through the Fastershire Stage 5 Dynamic Purchasing System and each successful supplier has signed a DPS Agreement with the council. Grant Funding Agreements have been issued to all participating premises except in the case of Cinderford and Northwick Park where agreements have been issued to the Forest Economic Partnership CIC and Northwick Park Estates respectively.
