Resident 3	<p>Dear Sirs</p> <p>Ref Proposed "No Waiting at any time" Restrictions on Knockerhill Lane, Herefordshire</p> <p>We write regarding the proposed traffic regulation order scheme detailed above.</p> <p>Whilst we totally agree that the parking if the vehicles along the Knockerhill Lane causes inconvenience the parking at the junctions is in fact dangerous.</p> <p>The vehicles being parked along this route are primarily personnel of the Suzuki Garage.</p> <p>Our concern is if the yellow lines are placed on the junction and part way up Knockerhill Lane the parking issue is just shifted. Their alternative will be to park along Grafton Lane. This is a single-track lane (with a private layby) and it would definitely not be appropriate for them to park on this road. However, this could be their only alternative. This would then lead to unsafe passage for vehicles on Grafton Lane instead. We would ask you to consider this at this time.</p>
