PQ 1	Name and address provided	On 1 June 2021, the CYP Scrutiny committee was offered a legal briefing by a member of the public who has been raising concerns for a number of years that Herefordshire Council's response to allegations of serious sexual assault and rape by a school student fails to take into account a school's legal duties under the Human Rights Act and the Equality Act.  This member of the public has been involved in successful legal action against a Herefordshire secondary school which put a child back into class with the boy identified as the rapist.  It is four months since the offer was made.
