Reasons for decision: To ensure that the council manages its transport services effectively whilst also meeting its statutory duties and ensures children are transported to school in line with eligibility. Highlight any associated The Passenger Transport Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS) complies fully with current procurement legislation, the risks/finance/legal/equal Councils contract procedure rules, and established best ity considerations: practice. Applicants to join the DPS have to complete a thorough evaluation questionnaire which is then checked for compliance by Passenger Transport and Commercial Services. Applicants are only allowed to join the DPS if they meet all of the specified criteria. The e-portal used to carry out tendering exercises under the DPS ensures that contracts are securely advertised to all qualifying parties. The Passenger Transport DPS ensures that contracts are awarded fairly and transparently based on specified evaluation criteria. Selection questionnaires, contract specifications and conditions of contract have been written in consultation with legal and commercial services. The listed contracts are required to provide transport to students who hold statutory entitlement. Contracts WF213S and WF214S being replacements of existing contracts handed back by the supplier. The remaining contracts being additional capacity to accommodate new applications. The financial implications of these changes are: An increase in SEN school transport costs of £29,733 in the 2021/22 An increase in mainstream school transport costs of £42,382 in the 2021/22 These additional costs can be afforded within service budgets, taking in to account service saving target S18 of £150k. However a further contribution to wider directorate savings, specifically saving E17 will not be possible. Some of these cost increases have resulted from retendering contracts handed back by suppliers due to the ongoing effects of Covid-19 and staff shortages. The replacement contracts being at a higher cost. It is likely that these types of funding pressures will continue to be seen over the remaining months of the 2021/22 financial year e.g. 5 contracts are currently being retendered after being handed back due to driver shortage. The resulting additional costs from this will be recorded in a further contract award RoOD in November 2021 once procurement is complete. Not to proceed with re-tendering or the award of contracts.
