Applicants to join the DPS have to complete a thorough evaluation questionnaire which is then checked for compliance by Passenger Transport and Commercial Services. Applicants are only allowed to join the DPS if they meet all of the specified criteria. The e-portal used to carry out tendering exercises under the DPS ensures that contracts are secure advertised to all qualifying parties. The Passenger Transport DPS ensures that contracts are awarded fairly and transparently based on specified evaluation criteria. Selection questionnaires, contract specifications and conditions of contract have been written in consultation with legal and commercial services.		
	The listed contracts are required to provide transport to students who hold statutory entitlement. Contracts WG211, TB213, TB214, QE211, QE212 being replacements of existing contracts handed back by the supplier. The remaining contracts being additional capacity to accommodate new applications.		
	The financial implications of these changes are:		
	 An increase in SEN school transport costs of £17,226 in the 2021/22 financial year causing a budget pressure on cost centre C03510 An increase in mainstream school transport costs of £7,710 in the 2021/22 financial year causing a budget pressure on cost centre C03073

	Some of these cost increases have resulted from retendering contracts handed back by suppliers due to the ongoing effects of Covid-19 and staff shortages. The replacement contracts being at a higher cost. It is likely that these types of funding pressures will continue to be seen over the remaining months of the 2021/22 financial year.
