Decision made:	A decision has been made to consent for the Central Tupsley Community Group to hold a bonfire and fireworks display at Tupsley Quarry on the 5 th November 2021.
Reasons for decision:	<p>To enable Tupsley Community group to hold a bonfire and fireworks display at Tupsley Quarry on the 5th November 2021.</p> <p>The group's event management plan and associated documents have been circulated and agreed by the Safety Advisory group.</p>
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:	<p>Legal - the landowner (HC) needs to give consent for the event to take place on their land.</p> <p>Risk assessments and appropriate documentation have been drawn up for the event and circulated and the consultees have raised no objection.</p> <p>There is a risk that the public indemnity cover is not sufficient; the group have been made aware of this and they have confirmed that numbers will be limited as per the insurance cover and confirmed that sufficient cover is in place.</p> <p>There is a risk that unsuitable items will be placed on the bonfire and cause a statutory nuisance. Advice has also been provided to the group as to what items are suitable and the group have given assurance that any unsuitable items have been removed.</p> <p>There will be a condition that consent can be withdrawn at short notice if the national guidance changes.</p>

	There will be a review undertaken of the event, this to be undertaken by 31 st July 2022.
Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	Not to issue the consent means the event cannot take place.
