Reasons for decision:	To ensure that the council manages its transport services effectively whilst also meeting its statutory duties and ensures children are transported to school in line with eligibility.					
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equal ity considerations:	The Passenger Transport Dynamic Purchasing System (DPS) complies fully with current procurement legislation, the Councils contract procedure rules, and established best practice. Applicants to join the DPS have to complete a thorough evaluation questionnaire which is then checked for compliance by Passenger Transport and Commercial Services. Applicants are only allowed to join the DPS if they meet all of the specified criteria. The e-portal used to carry out tendering exercises under the DPS ensures that contracts are securely advertised to all qualifying parties. The Passenger Transport DPS ensures that contracts are awarded fairly and transparently based on specified evaluation criteria. Selection questionnaires, contract specifications and conditions of contract have been written in consultation with legal and commercial services. Contracts BH211S and KM211S are to be funded by Children's Services. The financial implication of awarding contract AC214P is an increase in SEN transport costs of £5070 in the 2021/22					

	financial year adding to the budget pressure on the SEN transport cost centre.
