Ward:	Old Gore
Consultation:	The works promoter will carry out a letter drop at least 2 weeks prior to works commencing to inform and liaise with local residents and businesses likely to be affected by these works. Advance notice boards will also be displayed at the location of works to provide advance notice of the works. Details of these works, including the name of the works promoter, date, location and description of works will be included in the weekly Streetworks Report that is sent out to stakeholders including Parish Councils and local Ward Members, emergency services & transport companies.
Decision made:	To authorise the making of a Temporary Road Closure Order served under section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to require a temporary closure on the U67418, Kynaston Lane, Rushall, from the junction with the C1294, then northwards for approximately 200 metres, planned to be effective for a period of 9 days commencing on the 23 rd of February 2022.
Reasons for decision:	To enable BBLP to carry out drainage works within the highway, for which purpose the Council, as highway authority, consider the closure of the road is required due to the likelihood of danger to highway users while the said works are being carried out.
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/equality considerations:	Localised disruption on highway network which will be mitigated using diversion route signage and closure period to be kept at shortest possible duration. Pedestrian access to premises affected by this closure will be maintained.

Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	Not to introduce a temporary closure of the road; but there would then be operational difficulties in the said works being carried out, and/or would result in a longer period of disruption. In addition, there would be a greater risk to users of the highway and possible claims against the highway authority as a result.
