Consultation:	Consultation of this decision has taken place with the council's finance and legal services teams.
Decision made:	To allocate a contingency of £25,000 to the professional services contract for the outline design and consultation of the Cathedral and River Wye Quarter as part of the HCCI, which was awarded to Burroughs following an open competitive tender process.

	To extend the contract end date from 19 <sup>th</sup> January 2022 to 30 <sup>th</sup> July 2022.
Reasons for decision:	The Director for Economy and Place took a decision 18 December 2020 to authorise the commencement of a competitive procurement for professional services within a budget of £150,000. 	The Interim Director for Economy and Place took a further decision 30 August 2021 to award a professional services contract for the outline design and consultation of the Cathedral and River Wye Quarter as part of the HCCI to Burroughs at a tender value of £79,930 following an open competitive tender process. 	The contract has now been awarded and work is progressing but a contingency allowance was not included in the award decision that will enable the management of change and any risk. This decision is requesting approval to allocate £25,000 as a contingency which would give a potential contract value of £104,930 which is still within the allocated budget of £150,000 for this element of the HCCI.
	Any change to the project will be managed through the contractual change control mechanism and will be assessed and agreed by council Officers.
	The contract was initially advertised and awarded on a 3 month term in order to achieve the Marches LEP funding agreement timescales. It has since been agreed with the LEP that this element will be funded from the Council's match funding as part of the scheme, and following discussions with Burroughs regarding the programme of work a contract extension is being sought to 30 <sup>th</sup> June 2022.
Highlight any associated risks/finance/legal/ equality considerations:	Further contingency may be required over and above the value approved in this decision. Spend will be monitored throughout the project and will be managed through the council's project management system. There is remaining budget for this element and should further contingency be
	required this will be the subject of a further governance decision. If the required spend profile outlined by the Marches LEP as part of the funding agreement cannot be met then it may result in a loss of grant funding and the return to a fully council funded scheme.
Details of any alternative options considered and rejected:	Not to progress with the project. This is not recommended as this will reduce investment in Hereford city centre which is not consistent with the council's corporate policy to support the local economy and growth.
